Richmond Bridge and approaches congestion study

Community Consultation Workshop

Richmond Bridge and its approach roads are congested during morning and afternoon peak traffic periods. In April 2011 the Australian Government allocated \$2 million to investigate the bridge and adjoining approach road from Grose Vale Road to East Market Street.

The study is looking into how to improve traffic flow in the short-term and a possible road corridor in the vicinity of Richmond Bridge for future traffic needs. This type of study takes into account a range of issues including economic growth, ageing infrastructure, population increase and congestion to come up with both short and long term solutions.

Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) engaged Hyder Consulting to investigate options to improve traffic flow at Richmond Bridge and approach roads in the Richmond and North Richmond areas. A traffic congestion study for these short-term improvements is available to view or download on the RMS website at www.rms.gov.au/roadprojects.

An investigation for longer-term strategies for Richmond Bridge and adjoining approach roads is also being undertaken. Possible options will be displayed for community discussion later in 2012.

We want to understand your view about local traffic and ask for your input on:

- Short-term measures to improve traffic flow at Richmond Bridge and approach roads for the Richmond / North Richmond areas as outlined in the 2012 *Traffic Congestion Study*.
- Possible long-term strategies for Richmond Bridge and adjoining approach roads for the Richmond / North Richmond areas.
