Work to remove two trees on the March and Bosworth streets intersection upgrade, Richmond.

The Australian and NSW governments are improving traffic flow and reducing congestion on the March and Bosworth streets intersection.

What is happening?

We wrote to you in May about the need to remove additional street trees to make way for relocated utilities, the widened road and new footpath being built along March Street.

Our work is progressing well. However, further investigation has shown we will need to remove two further street trees from the project area.

The first tree is outside 178-180 March Street. Its roots have grown into a stormwater pit, which needs to be replaced. Our arborist has advised that the tree would not survive the significant root trimming and concrete work we need to do and so has recommended that the tree be removed.

The second tree is outside 155a March Street. Unfortunately this tree is too close to where the new kerb will be built and needs to be removed.

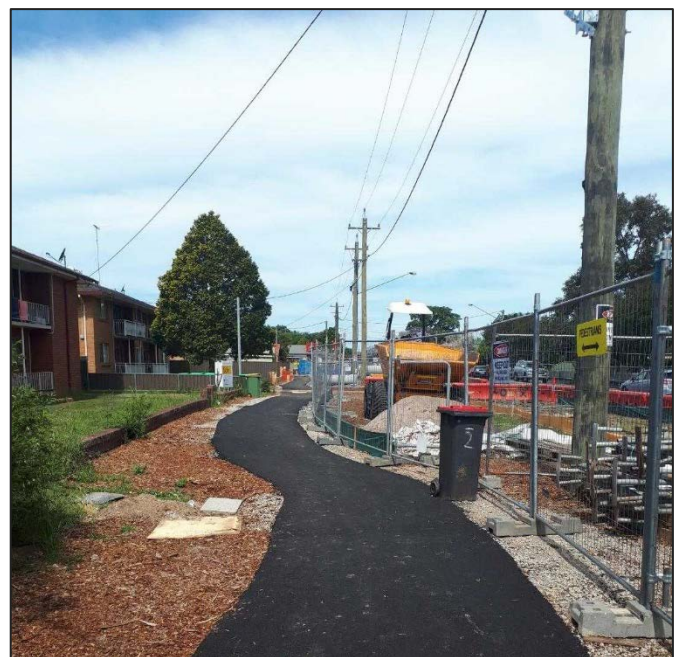


Image: temporary pedestrian pathway is in place around the work zone while we widen the road

Replacement landscaping plans

A draft landscaping plan is shown below. We are working with landscape designers and Hawkesbury City Council to further develop our plan and choose plants that best fit with the character of the local area.

The two additional trees to be removed will be replaced with suitable species in consultation with Council.
