

Revised project schedule for remaining work on the Kamilaroi Highway between Baan Baa and Turrawan

The NSW Government is funding \$26.4 million to boost safety on the Kamilaroi Highway between Baan Baa and Turrawan as part of the Saving Lives on Country Roads program.

Due to resourcing impacts from crews being diverted to heavy patching works for essential flood recovery across the state, the delivery schedule for the remaining sections of work has been reviewed.

The overall completion milestone for the entire project remains on track for completion by June 2023, weather permitting.

The revised delivery schedule for the project includes:

- **Section 1 and 3 completed**
- **Section 2 in progress** – culvert works are continuing in this section, then from August all crews will return to complete remaining works which will take approximately two months to complete, weather permitting.
- **Section 4 in development** – construction is expected to start in October 2022, weather permitting. Early works including vegetation clearing will start from August and culvert construction from September 2022. Transport will consult with affected landholders in Section 4 ahead of the work.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Reduced speed limits will be in place during work hours for the safety of our customers and staff. Motorists should allow extra travel time during this work.

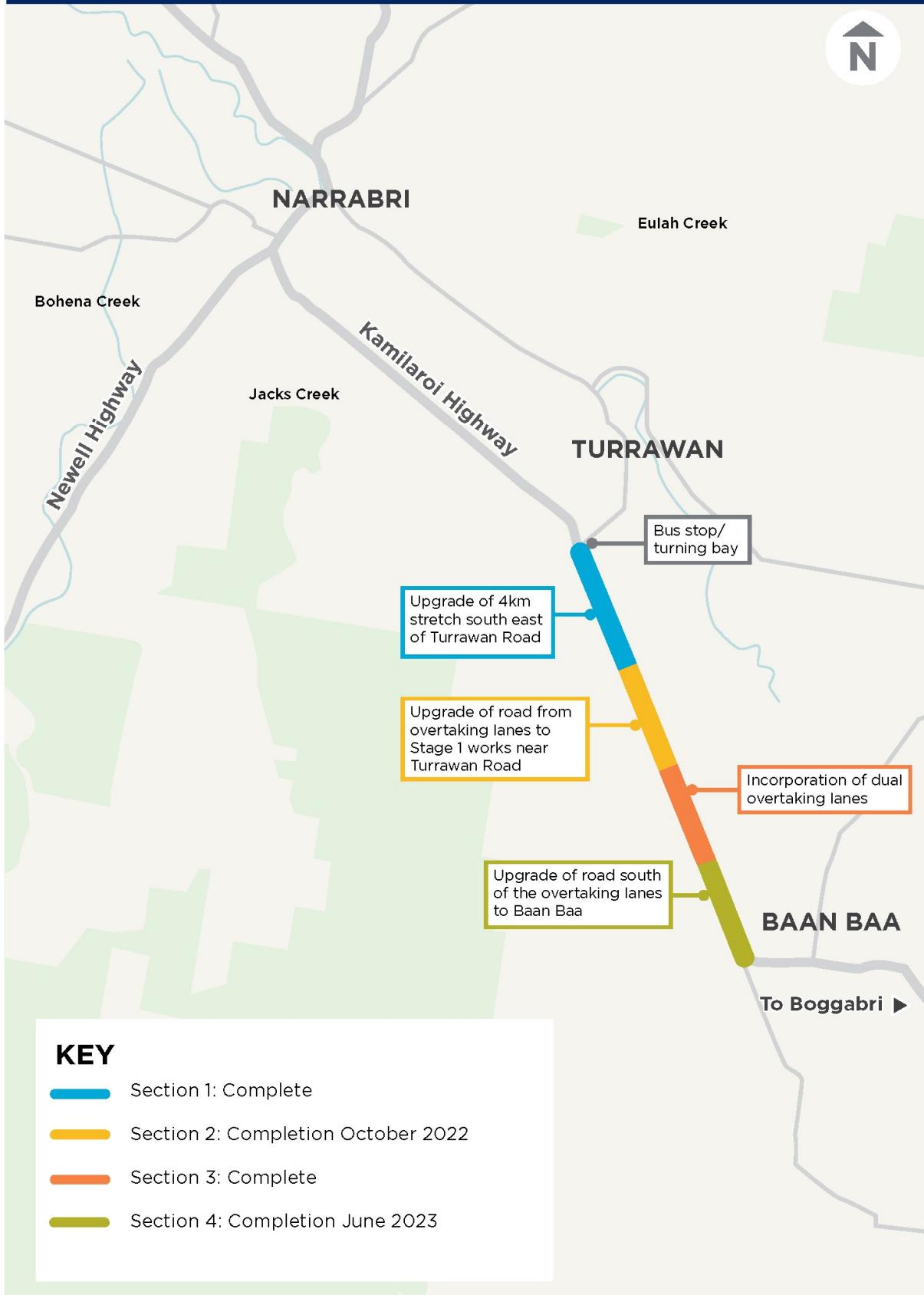
