

Extended work hours for safety upgrades on the Kamilaroi Highway between Baan Baan and Turrawan from 21 February

The NSW Government is funding \$26.4 million to boost safety on the Kamilaroi Highway between Baan Baa and Turrawan as part of the Saving Lives on Country Roads program.

Transport for NSW is continuing work on section two of the project including the installation of pipe culverts to enable shoulder widening and drainage improvements. We have included a map over the page to show the location of the work that is being carried out.

To reduce the impacts on traffic and access for over size vehicles travelling through the project site, we will be working 24 hours a day from **Monday to Saturday**, starting on Monday 21 February for four weeks. Our out of hours working hours will be 6pm to 7am and traffic control will be in place.

Our standard working hours of 7am to 6pm will continue in section two until it is completed in mid-2022.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some noise associated with this work. We will make every effort to minimise noise by arranging the work in stages at different locations and turning off plant and machinery when not in use.

Traffic changes

Temporary traffic changes will continue to be in place to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane closures may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.
