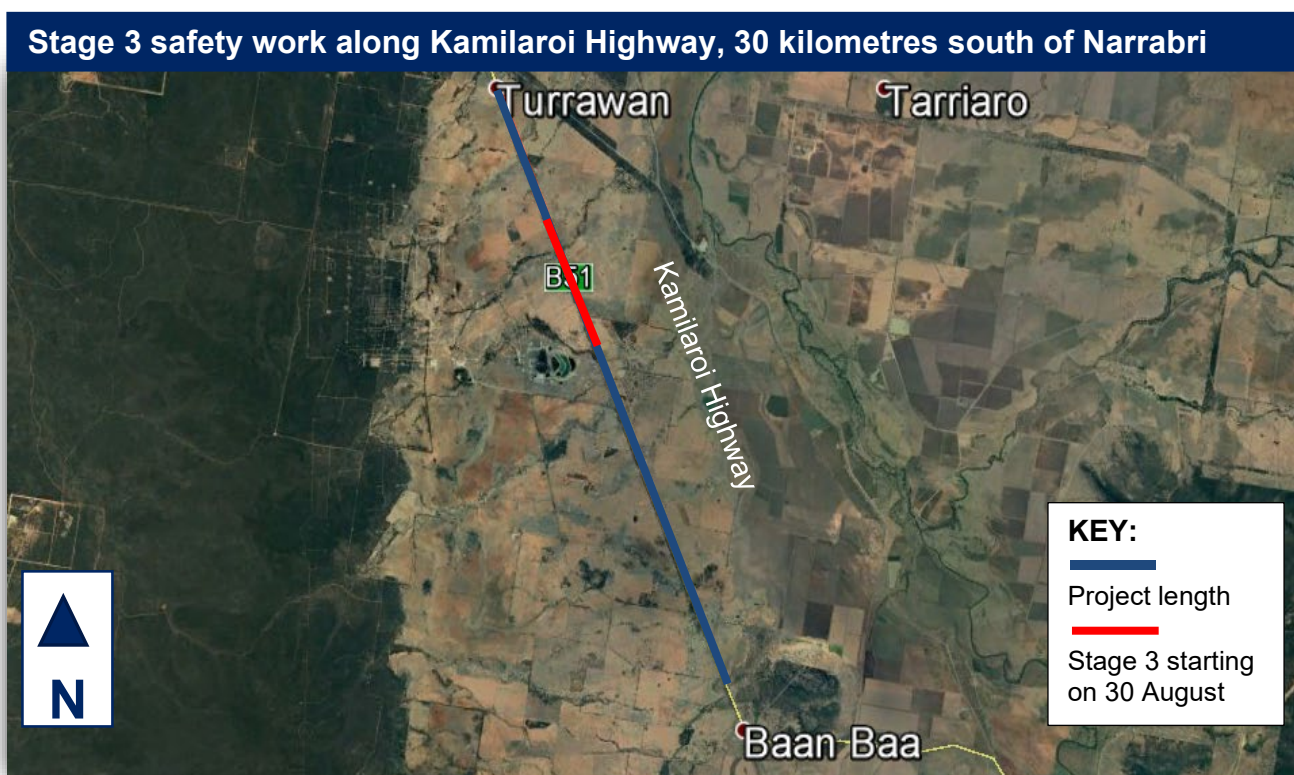


Safety upgrades continue on the Kamilaroi Highway between Baan Baa and Turrawan from August 30

The NSW Government is funding \$26.4 million to improve safety along a 17 kilometre section of the Kamilaroi Highway to improve safety for all road users.



Transport for NSW is carrying out the next stage of the safety improvement work along a 3.35 kilometre section of the Kamilaroi Highway, 30 kilometres south of Narrabri.

This is the third stage of work on the project and early work will start on 30 August with vegetation removal. Major work will start two weeks later which includes installation of centre barrier and edge barriers, widening work and the construction of a pullover bay for oversized vehicles.

The second stage of work will be completed in September and includes the construction of dual, 1.8 kilometre overtaking lanes, as well as widening work and the installation of safety barriers.

Work hours will be between **7am** and **6pm** from **Monday** to **Friday** and **7am** to **4pm Saturdays**.

We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

Work is expected to be complete by April 2022, weather permitting.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use. Please exercise caution as you enter and exit your property.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.
