

Spring Farm Parkway Stage 1

Project Update June 2022

Spring Farm Parkway is a key east-west link that will support the Greater Macarthur Growth Area, meeting the needs of a growing population by providing an access connection for surrounding future and existing residential and industrial developments.

About the project

Stage 1 of Spring Farm Parkway will provide new four lane divided road extending about 1km from Menangle Road, west over the Hume Motorway to Menangle Park Urban Release Area. The project will:

- upgrade 600m of Menangle Road at Menangle Park including a new signalised intersection at the Spring Farm Parkway
- new southbound exit ramp from the Hume Motorway onto Spring Farm Parkway and Menangle Road
- new northbound entry ramp from Spring Farm Parkway and Menangle Road to the Hume Motorway
- four new signalised intersections including:
 - Spring Farm Parkway and Menangle Road
 - exit ramp from the Hume Motorway onto Spring Farm Parkway and Menangle Road
 - entry ramp from Spring Farm Parkway to the Hume Motorway
 - access to Menangle Park Urban Release Area.

Start of construction

Transport for NSW (Transport) has appointed Georgiou Group to deliver the Spring Farm Parkway Stage 1 project. Work is scheduled to start in July 2022, and expected to be completed by late 2024.

The benefits of this project include:

- connecting communities and support residential growth
- providing a key east-west connection for residents of Macarthur
- providing safe and efficient access to and from the Hume Motorway
- improving travel time reliability and efficiency for road users
- providing a safe and effective crossing for pedestrians and cyclists over the Hume Motorway to Broughton Anglican College.

Working with you

Transport and its delivery partners work hard to reduce impact from construction activities by:



Notifying the community about the nature and timing of construction activity in advance of it starting



Consulting the local community on work that may impact property access



Completing noisier construction night work in the earliest part of the night, where possible



Monitoring noise and dust levels



Providing a 24-hour project information line for community inquiries.

What else is happening in the area

- **Spring Farm Parkway Stage 2** is currently in the strategic concept design phase. Early this year, Transport consulted with stakeholders and community on the proposed design. Project team is reviewing feedback to help inform the project.
- **Appin Road Link Road Corridor** is in the feasibility phase to identify the most suitable route option for an east-west link between Appin Road and Menangle Road. Project team is reviewing feedback to help inform the location of the preferred corridor.
- **Dust bowl truck stop** located on the Hume Motorway, will be closed to the general public once construction begins on Spring Farm Parkway Stage 1 project. Oversize overmass vehicles will continue to access the current area up until November 2022. A new rest area at Pheasants Nest has been identified. Further updates on this location will be provided in future community notifications.

Transport will continue working with the freight industry on suitable location for overmass vehicles.
- **Appin Road improvements** are currently undertaking investigations for future proofing of the area along Appin Road.





Upcoming work

Work scheduled over the next three months includes:

- establishing site compounds
- installing temporary traffic signs and safety barriers
- adjustment of existing traffic conditions
- surveying and investigating existing utilities including drainage and electricity
- installing environmental controls including water basins and sediment fencing to reduce environmental impacts
- bulk earthworks and stormwater drainage for road construction, including temporary pavements
- relocating public utilities including gas, electricity, telephone and water services along the route.

The site compound will be on Menangle Road (opposite Broughton Anglican College).

Various locations, within the site compound, will be used for the temporary stockpile and storage of:

- excess fill materials for later use
- road base materials
- construction materials
- other site sheds and compounds.

We will progress with this work to set up the project construction site, and will continue to notify landowners of any potential impacts before works begin.

Noise

We will reduce noise by:

- turning off machinery when not in use
- positioning equipment such as generators as far away as possible
- using non-intrusive reversing alarms on all machinery.

Construction hours

Most of the work will be carried out during standard working hours **between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday** and, **Saturday between 8am and 1pm**, weather permitting. Night and weekend work will be required from time to time to reduce impact on the travelling public. We will notify you in advance if we need to work outside of standard working hours.

Traffic

To enable the safety of road users and workers during construction, reduced speed limits will be in place. These include:

- 60km/h speed limit through the Menangle Road construction zone
- 80km/h speed limit through the Hume Motorway construction zone.

There will be times where speeds may be reduced in some areas to 40km/h to further enable safe works.

Signage will be in place to notify road users of any changes.
