



Night work on Stacey Street, Bankstown from Wednesday 29 January

The NSW Government is investing more than \$30 million to upgrade Stacey Street and Fairford Road in Bankstown.

We will be widening Stacey Street, northbound to provide an additional lane between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street and upgrading the key intersections of Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street.

Our night works will include:

- tree clearing
- installation of concrete barriers
- excavation and storm water trenching and installation
- service investigations, potholing and road coring

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit livetraffic.com or download the Live Traffic NSW App.

How will the work affect you?

Our work will be noisy at times, including saw cutting, but we will do everything we can to minimise the impact to residents, including completing the noisier tasks by midnight. Transport for NSW understands that noise during road construction can be a source of frustration for residents living near our project. Our work schedule will help us complete our work sooner, limiting the impact on the local community.

Our work schedule

We will be on site for up to 25 night shifts from Wednesday 29 January to Thursday 9 April, weather permitting.

Our night shift hours will be between **9pm** and **5am Sunday** to **Thursday**.


We will continue working during the day. Our day shift hours between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am and 1pm on Saturday.
