# Improvements to Stacey Street and Fairford Road, Bankstown

Open to traffic | July 2021



Recently-completed intersection work on Macauley Avenue and Fairford Road

Transport for NSW has recently completed improvements to the widening of Stacey Street northbound, to provide an additional lane between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street.

Upgrades have been carried out at the intersections of Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street. Funded under the NSW Government's \$300 million Gateway to the South Pinch Point Program which aims to ease congestion and improve journey reliability on Sydney's key western corridors.

## Work completed

- Widening the roadway between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street to include an additional third lane northbound and southbound
- Constructed a retaining wall and capping beam along Stacey Street northbound
- Extended right-hand turn bay from Stacey Street southbound into Stanley Street. Extended and

added 2nd right turn bay from Stacey Street southbound into Macauley Avenue

- Storm water upgrades between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street
- Installed new kerb and gutter and footpath between Macauley Avenue and Stanley Street
- Upgraded the intersections of Macauley Avenue and Fairford Road and Stanley Street and Stacey Street
- Installation of an additional right turning lane and a separate bus lane onto Fairford Road from Macauley Avenue
- Constructed and relocated pedestrian signalised crossing at Macauley Avenue to the northern side of the intersection and new signalised pedestrian crossing at Salvia Avenue.

## Traffic Changes

We still need to do some minor work at night including concreting and landscaping works.

Traffic will not be affected during the day.

## Project benefits

These improvement works aim to ease congestion for the high numbers of vehicles using this section of the Stacey Street corridor, by providing additional north and south bound lanes on Stacey Street.

Traffic flow has been improved onto Stanley Street from Stacey Street south bound by extending the right turning bay. An additional 2nd right hand turning bay has been added from Stacey Street into Macauley Avenue.
