Airport East precinct upgrade – Additional storage site

The Australian and NSW Governments are upgrading roads east of Sydney Airport to improve traffic flow and access to the airport and Port Botany.

As part of the Airport East Project, an additional storage site is required and will be established in the vacant land on the corner of Dransfield Avenue and Wentworth Avenue, Mascot. The site will be used to store construction equipment and material.

We have included a map to show the location of the storage site.

Community Consultation

We recently consulted with the local community about the storage site, to help understand any concerns and answer questions. We have reviewed the feedback we received, and will take additional measures to reduce any impact for local residents. In planning for this site we have:

- established a Vehicle Movement Plan for the use of the site. Traffic associated with this work site will only enter and exit via the site gate at the top of Dransfield Avenue and will not travel past the site gate, located 25 metres into Dransfield Avenue. We will carefully monitor vehicle movements on Dransfield Avenue during use of the site.
- carried out a flora and fauna assessment of the area. Our assessment identified that only a small section of vegetation will need to be removed, and this area has been identified as having noxious weeds present. Most of the native vegetation in the eastern section will be retained.
- arranged for a local beekeeping association to successfully relocate a feral European honeybee colony identified in the area. This relocation means we can now tidy up and fence the area, including removing rubbish that has been illegally dumped.
- committed to carrying out noise monitoring when this area is being used outside of standard working hours. We will use this information to assess if any additional noise mitigation measures can be implemented to reduce impact to the local community.

This vacant land is owned by Roads and Maritime Services and was assessed for use as part of this project during the development of the Review of Environmental Factors in 2015. This storage site will only be used for the length of the project. We will remove the site facility and rehabilitate the land once the project is finished.

The storage site will be used to store construction equipment and materials, including utility pits, pipes and landscape material such as topsoil and gravel. This area will not be used as a site office or to store any hazardous goods.

Site set up

Work to set up the storage site will start from **Monday 18 September 2017** and take two weeks to complete, weather permitting. Site set up will occur during our standard construction hours, between **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday** and **8am to 1pm** on **Saturday**. There may be some noise, dust and disruption associated with the set up and use of this storage site. We will control dust with water carts.

Work to set up the site will include:

- clearing some vegetation and trees
- installing fencing and environmental controls
- minor earthwork to prepare the area for use.

Machinery and equipment used during the set up may include excavators, trucks, rollers, mobile cranes, chain saws, mulching machines, generators, hand tools and light vehicles.

Site use

The site will operate during approved day and night working hours for the length of the project. The storage site will only be used intermittently outside of standard construction hours.

Out of hours work is needed on this project, because of the traffic conditions in the area and the limitations of working next to the Sydney Airport east west runway and the Port Botany Rail Line. Night work on the project is usually carried out between **9pm** and **5am**, up to five nights a week.

We will make every effort to minimise noise during night work by using the site at night only when necessary.

Machinery and equipment used may include an excavator, trucks, lighting towers and light vehicles. Lighting towers will be positioned away from residential properties at night.
