

Airport precinct upgrade – Weekly update

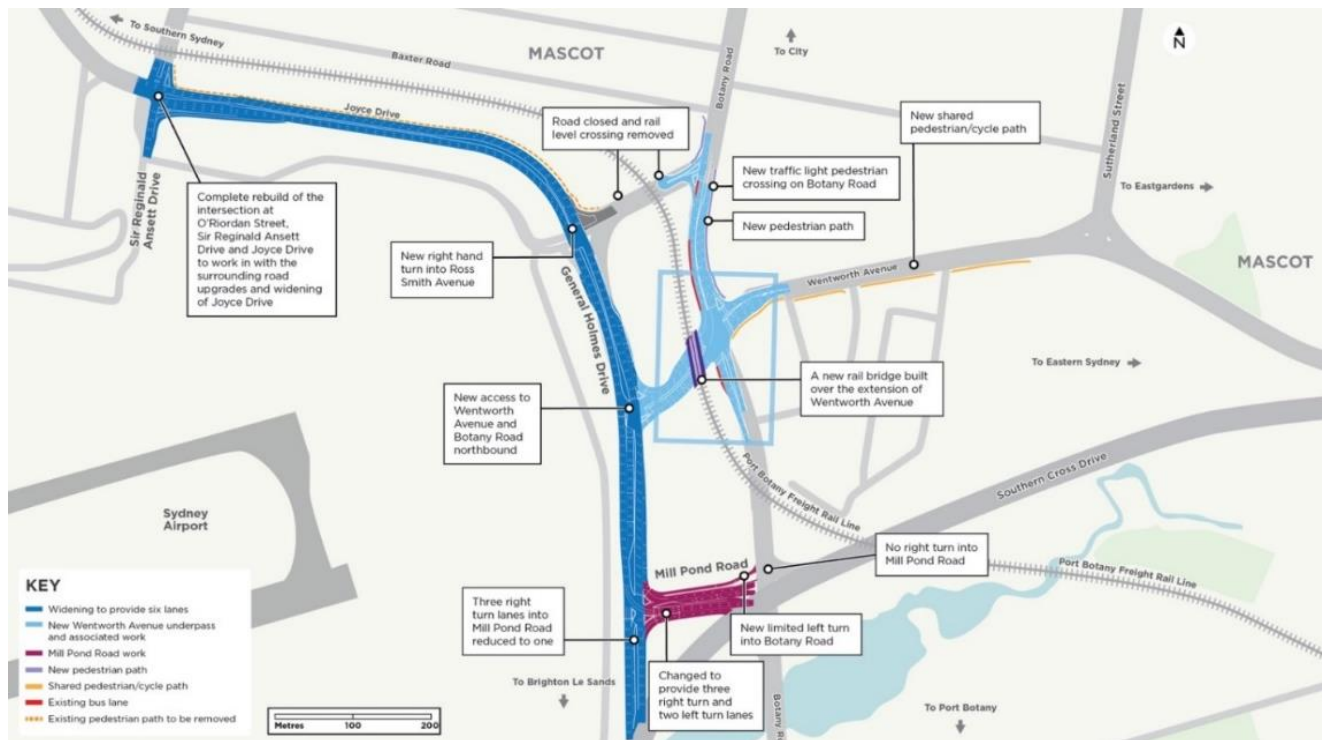
Week commencing Sunday 12 May 2019

Airport East project work includes:

- service identification and roadwork on General Holmes Drive, Mill Pond Drive and Joyce Drive
- construction work inside the site compound area on Wentworth Avenue and along the work areas on Botany Road and Wentworth Avenue including, stormwater work, traffic light adjustment and pavement work
- footpath and kerb adjustment at the Botany Road end of Bronti Street
- construction work at the new Wentworth Avenue underpass
- identifying underground utility locations and pavement investigation along Botany Road, Botany Lane, Bronti Street, Mill Pond Drive, Wentworth Avenue, Hardie Street, Beresford Street, General Holmes Drive and Joyce Drive
- use of the storage site in Dransfield Avenue
- construction work, including access, spoil and vegetation removal from Mill Pond Drive
- operating and monitoring groundwater systems 24/7
- delivery of construction vehicles and equipment to the work areas

Standard construction hours for the **Airport East project** are from **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday** and **8am to 1pm on Saturday**, excluding public holidays. Out of hours work will include up to **five-night shifts** during the week and extended hours on **Saturday from 1pm to 6pm** and on **Sunday between 8am and 6pm**. Our night working hours are **9pm to 5am**. Not all work during this time will be noisy.

Airport East Precinct Upgrade



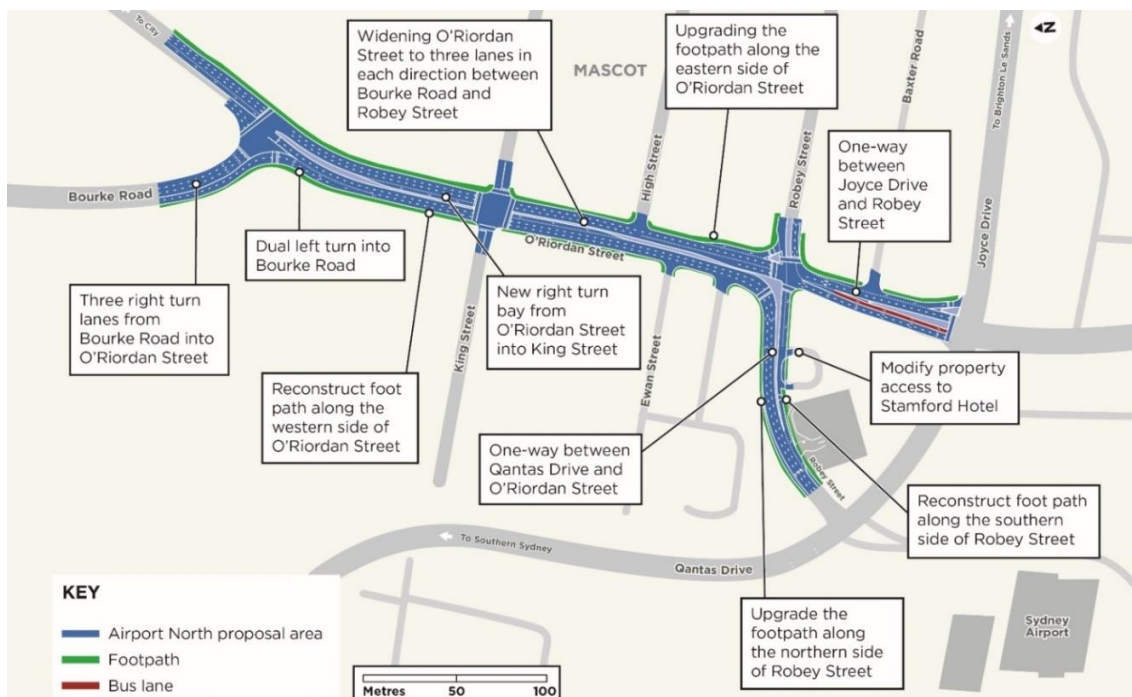
Airport North project work includes:

- road work, including kerb removal, light pole footing installation and barrier adjustment along O’Riordan Street near Bourke Road, Robey Street and Baxter Road
- utility trenching, road crossing, stormwater and watermain work along O’Riordan Street between Bourke Road and Robey Street
- traffic management and roadwork, including temporary line marking, sign and traffic barrier installation and temporary traffic changes along O’Riordan Street between Bourke Road and Joyce Drive
- the pedestrian footpath is closed on the eastern side of O’Riordan Street between High Street and Baxter Road – pedestrian diversions are in place.
- service identification in O’Riordan Street, Bourke Road, High Street, King Street, Robey Street and Baxter Road. This involves the use of a vacuum truck to safely identify the locations of the underground services
- ongoing pedestrian changes and detours during construction work, please follow direction of signage
- installation of environmental controls, including excavation and material removal in work areas along O’Riordan Street
- use of site compounds at 166 and 200 O’Riordan Street for delivery and removal of equipment and materials
- operating and monitoring groundwater systems 24/7
- delivery of construction vehicles and equipment to the work areas

Weekend road work from Friday night 17 May until 5am Monday morning 20 May at the Bourke Road and O’Riordan Street intersection. See separate notification for more details on this work.

Standard construction hours for the **Airport North project** are from **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm on Saturday**, excluding public holidays. Out of hours work will include up to **five-night shifts** during the week and extended hours on Saturday. Our night working hours are **9pm to 5am**. Not all work during this time will be noisy.
