Ramp closure on the M4 Motorway at The Northern Road

The Australian and NSW Governments are jointly funding this work as part of the \$1.6 billion upgrade of The Northern Road between Narellan and South Penrith.

Transport for New South Wales is continuing works along The Northern Road between Glenmore Park and South Penrith. As part of these works, there will be traffic changes at the M4 Motorway eastbound off ramp onto The Northern Road.

What we are doing?

We will be temporarily closing the M4 Motorway eastbound off ramp onto The Northern Road to undertake asphaltting work.

For the safety of road users and workers, the eastbound off ramp onto The Northern Road will be closed from **8pm Tuesday 6 July to 5am Wednesday 7 July**, with 8pm Wednesday 7 July to 5am Thursday 8 July as contingency.

Traffic changes

Please see the map overleaf to better explain the location of this work and the detours in place for night work.

When the ramp is closed, detours will be in place via Mulgoa Road, Jane Street and North Street.

How this work will affect you?

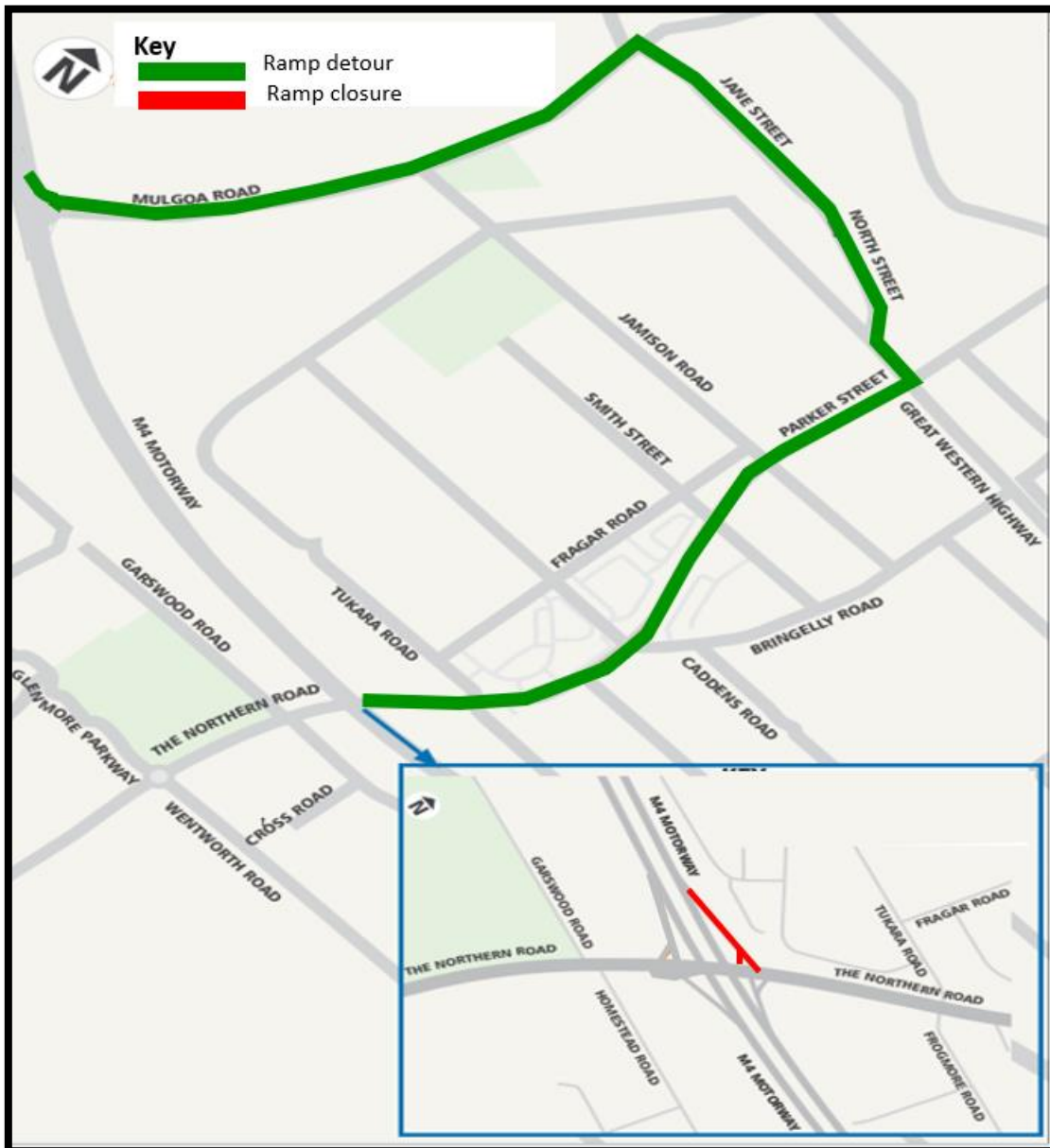
During our work, every effort will be made to minimize the impacts to the community by:

- Using non-tonal reversing beepers on machinery
- Turning off equipment and vehicles when not in use
- Using lighting towers
- Directing noise generating equipment away from properties where possible

What equipment will be used?

Asphaltting machines, construction machinery, light and heavy vehicles, lighting towers, power, and hand tools.
