

Victoria Bridge upgrade Stage 1 – extended closures from Tuesday 23 February

Transport for NSW is upgrading the historic Victoria Bridge over Stonequarry Creek, Picton. The upgrade will improve longevity and reduce future maintenance costs for this historically significant bridge.

Extended closures

From **Tuesday 23 February** to **Friday 26 February**, weather permitting, the bridge will be closed to vehicle traffic for extended hours to finalise replacing the timber top chords.

- **Tuesday 23 February** and **Wednesday 24 February** – Day and night closure from **12pm Tuesday to 5pm Wednesday** to install the new timber top chord on the bridge. A crane will on-site from 3pm on the Tuesday to lower the new top chord into place.
- **Thursday 25 February** – Usual dayshift closure from **9am to 3:30pm**
- **Friday 26 February** – Extended dayshift closure from **7am to 5pm** to finalise truss work.

Pedestrian access across the bridge will be maintained during this work.

Traffic will be detoured via Menangle Street, Colden Street, Margaret Street, Old Hume Highway and Argyle Street. We have included a map on the other side of this notification.

In the event of an emergency requiring the bridge to be used as an evacuation route, work will be stopped and the bridge will be reopened to vehicle traffic.

Please keep to the speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.
