

## Investigation work on Waratah Street and Princes Highway, Kirrawee

Transport for NSW | March 2021

Transport for NSW will be carrying out investigation works on Waratah Street and Princes Highway in Kirrawee. Some work will also be completed in the surrounding streets.

Our work will include investigating ground conditions, including soil sampling, potholing, drilling, coring, excavation, and photogrammetry. This work will involve some noisy activities such as concrete cutting, jack hammering or chain sawing.

These investigations are being carried out to gather information about the ground conditions to help develop designs for future road improvements.

We have included a map to show the full area of the work, however most of the work will be concentrated on the Princes Highway and Waratah Street intersection itself.



## Our work schedule

We will carry out this work over three months, starting **Monday 8 March 2021**, weather permitting. We will be on site for up to **14 night shifts**.

Our night shift hours will be between **8pm** and **5am** from **Sunday** to **Friday**. We will not work on public holidays.

## How will the work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times but we will do everything we can to minimise its impact, including completing the noisier tasks by **midnight**.

## Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes while workers are on site. A work zone speed of 40 km/h will be imposed on adjacent traffic to ensure safety.

Isolated lane closures and footpath closures may be in place, however traffic will be maintained along both Waratah Street & Princes Hwy at all times.
