Waratah Street and Princes Highway Intersection Upgrade

Investigation work on the Princes Highway, Kirrawee from 19 September 2022

The Australian Government and NSW Government are jointly funding the upgrade of the intersection at Waratah Street and Princes Highway. The project will reduce traffic congestion and improve road access and safety for all users.

Transport for NSW will be carrying out investigation work around the Hotham Road pedestrian bridge on the Princes Highway. Work will commence from 19 September 2022 and will allow the project team to gather information about the ground conditions and develop the design for future improvements.

The work will specifically involve:

- Surveying the access area around the pedestrian ramp
- Land surveying of the area
- Measuring bridge elements

Our work schedule

We will carry out this work between Monday 19 September and Monday 3 October 2022, weather permitting. We will be on site for up to 3 night shifts.

Our night work hours will be 8pm to 5am Sunday to Friday. We will not work on public holidays.

How will the work impact me?

Our work is mainly investigating ground conditions and surveying. This means it will not involve noisy activities such as jack hammering or using chain saws.

There will be temporary traffic changes while workers are on site. The speed limit in the work zone will be reduced to 40 km/h to ensure safety for the workers. Lane and footpath closures may be in place, however traffic will be always maintained along both Waratah Street and Princes Highway.
