

## Night work on the Great Western Highway at Mount Lambie Wednesday, 28 September

The NSW Government is funding this essential maintenance work on the Great Western Highway to provide a stronger, longer lasting and safer road.

Transport for NSW will carry out the work, which involves the repair of wire rope safety barriers in the centre of the road, and routine maintenance as required. We have included a map to show the location of the work.

Work will take place between **8pm** and **5am** on **Wednesday, 28 September**, and we expect to complete this work in one night, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

### Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

The westbound lane will be closed, traffic will operate under stop slow alternating traffic with a reduced speed limit of 40 km/h in place for the safety of workers and motorists.

Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs. Motorists should allow an extra five minutes travel time. For the latest traffic updates, you can call 132 701, visit [livetraffic.com](https://www.livetraffic.com) or download the Live Traffic NSW App.

### How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Access for residents and emergency service vehicles will be maintained.

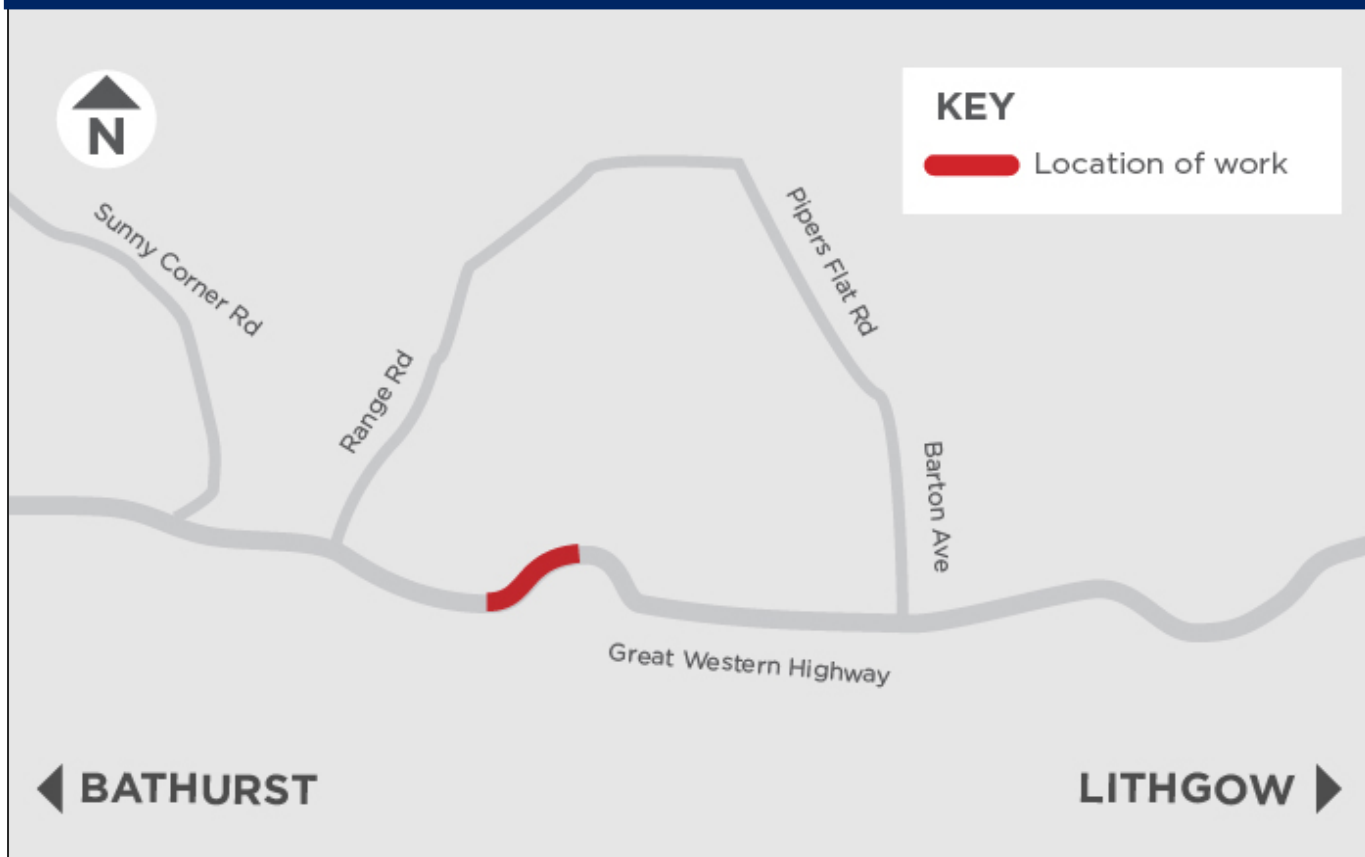
