Windsor Bridge replacement project

Construction update - October 2019

Major work is continuing on the new Windsor Bridge to help improve traffic flow and provide a safe and reliable crossing over the Hawkesbury River at Windsor.



The bridge is now fully launched to the southern side

Work to be carried out in October 2019 includes:

Bridge construction

The final bridge launch was completed on 16 September 2019, ahead of schedule.

Concrete work will continue at each abutment to complete the bridge approaches.

Now that we have launched all bridge segments, we will continue to remove the concrete casting bed from the northern end of the new bridge and its supporting structures.

The marine access platforms will remain in position as we reconfigure the bridge bearings, scheduled to commence this month. Our floating pontoons may remain in place to provide access for this work.

The barge will remain in place in the project area.

Utility relocations

We are upgrading the existing sewer infrastructure between the areas north and south of the river.

To complete this work new sewer infrastruvture will be installed and tied into the existing sewer infrastructure.

We are also upgrading the electrical network along Bridge Street and surrounding areas. This includes the decommissioning of some of the old streetlights and installing new streetlights and poles. We are installing new underground networks are also being installed to provide power for future services and some new electrical lanterns

We will also remove an existing water main along the southern side of Wilberforce Road. Work will include some investigation and preparation work to connect existing customer services to the larger existing mains.

New underground provisions for traffic control will continue to be networks along Bridge Street between Macquarie Street and George Street.

To support this we will install new:

- pits
- underground infrastructure
- new footings for the new poles.

We will continue to notify affected residents separately before any proposed noisy or night works.

Roadwork

Work is continuing near the intersection of Bridge and George Streets includes footpath reinstatement and finishing paving work.

This work involves roadwork and landscaping and will continue east of the new bridge from the George and Bridge streets intersection, downhill to The Terrace.

The work behind the barriers continues and includes archaeology, building new road surfaces, installing services and overhead electrical work.

Work will commence to build the new road alignment on the northern side of the river. During this time there will be an increase in truck movements.

We will continue to notify affected residents separately before any proposed noisy or night work.

Archaeology

Archaeologists will continue to work in the project area when required.

Our work schedule

Work will generally be carried out during standard construction hours between **7am** and **6pm** on weekdays and from **8am** to **1pm** on **Saturday**.

The out of hours work will continue into October along Bridge Street between Macquarie Street and George Street between **9pm and 5am Monday to Friday.**

There will also be some extended hours on **Saturdays** from **8am** to **4pm**.

How the work will affect you

There may be some noise and disruption associated with this work including vehicle movements. We are continuing to make every effort to minimise noise and disruption to the community during construction.

Temporary traffic changes (including lane closures, road closures and detours) will be in place to ensure the work zone is safe. Please follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.
