



Circular Quay investigations taking place from 3 April 2018.

The NSW Government has announced it is committed to upgrading the Circular Quay ferry wharves. The wharves need to be upgraded to make them accessible for all customers and support future growth.

As part of this work, Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is conducting investigations at Circular Quay and the immediate surrounding area from 3 April to July 2018. Information is being collected using:

Geophysical survey involving a scan of the surrounding land and water to determine the exact locations for the geotechnical investigations.

Due to the high number of transport customers and pedestrians in Circular Quay, some of the works will need to be undertaken at night as well as during the day. However, where practicable, work hours will be 7am to 6pm Mondays to Fridays and 8am to 1pm Saturdays.

Other early work includes assessing the condition of the wharves and locating services and utilities.

Geotechnical investigations help to understand what lies beneath the surface. It involves drilling boreholes to collect samples from approximately 15 sites. While the exact drilling locations are yet to be determined, they are likely to be on the eastern and southern promenade, on the wharves and on the water using a temporary barge. Investigations at each site will continue for approximately 48 hours. Another notification in late April / May will provide detailed information about the location and timeframe for this.

Drilling boreholes may lead to some noise. Machinery will be switched off when not in use and/or reduced to idle speed to minimise noise.

How will work affect you?

TfNSW is committed to minimising the impact to residents, businesses, transport customers and visitors. Circular Quay will remain open and Sydney Trains, Harbour City Ferries, Manly Fast Ferry, Captain Cook Cruises, Australian Cruise Group, water taxis, jet boat services and other private boat services will all continue to operate.

Access to ferry wharves, properties and businesses will be maintained, however small temporary work sites enclosed with hoardings will need to be established on the promenade and on the wharves. This means that small areas may be temporarily unavailable for approximately 48 hours.

No work will take place during the VIVID festival (26 May to 17 June) due to the high number of people in the Circular Quay precinct during this time.
