

Power Supply Upgrade Program

Surry Hills to Central Station Feeder Upgrade

COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

AUGUST- SEPTEMBER 2019

Transport for NSW is upgrading electrical infrastructure as part of the Power Supply Upgrade Program, which is designed to meet expected power requirements for Sydney's future rail network and new fleet of air-conditioned trains.

A new power supply cable will be installed between the Ausgrid Substation in Ann Street, Surry Hills and the Chalmers Street Substation at Central Station. Novo Rail is delivering the project on behalf of Transport for NSW.

Upcoming construction activities

We will carry out service investigation works along Albion Street, Elizabeth Street and Eddy Avenue, Surry Hills, prior to the installation of the new underground power supply cable (see work area map).

These activities relate to power supply services within the rail corridor only and will not affect power at residential or commercial properties.

The dates and times are indicative and may be subject to change. Traffic delays may be experienced, however every effort will be made to keep any delays to a minimum.

Elizabeth Street and Eddy Avenue, Surry Hills

Dates	Work Hours	Scope
Monday 26 August until Friday 30 August	Monday- Friday, 7am - 6pm	Underground service searching within the Elizabeth Street garden area, on the corner of Elizabeth Street and Eddy Avenue, Surry Hills.
		A pedestrian detour will be in place around the work site. This is a continuation of work that commenced in this area earlier in the month.
Monday 16 September to Friday 27 September	Monday- Friday, 7am - 6pm	A temporary site compound will be established within the Elizabeth Street garden area. This compound will be in place until early 2020. A pedestrian detour will be in place around the work site.

Albion Street, Surry Hills

Date	Work Hours	Scope
Ongoing to Saturday 21 September	Monday- Friday, 7am - 6pm	Underground service investigations along Albion Street, between Elizabeth Street and Riley Street, Surry Hills.
	Saturday 8am - 1pm	Up to eight parking spaces will be temporarily removed in stages as the work moves along Albion Street (in the parking lane) between Mary Street and Riley Street, Surry Hills.
		Between 10am and 3pm, a temporary lane closure will be in place along Albion Street between Elizabeth Street and Riley Street, Surry Hills, while underground service investigations are carried out. There may be minor traffic delays on Albion Street.
Sunday 1 September to Thursday 26 September	Sunday- Thursday, 7pm - 5am	Underground service investigations along Albion Street, between Mary Street and Riley Street, Surry Hills. These works will be carried out at night to reduce traffic impacts.
		Temporary road and lane closures will be in place while service investigations are carried out along the south side of Albion Street, at the intersection of the adjacent side streets. This will require the temporary closure of Mary, Commonwealth, Belmore and Bellevue Streets, where they intersect with Albion Street. Closures will be in place for one to two nights only at each location while the work is carried out.
		Traffic control, electronic sign boards and detour signs will be in place to provide directions to motorists. These works will be carried out at night to reduce traffic impacts.

Frog Hollow Reserve, Surry Hills

Date	Work Hours	Scope
Mid to late September	Monday- Friday, 7am - 6pm Saturday 8am - 1pm	Underground service searching within Frog Hollow Reserve. Access to the reserve will be maintained at all times, with pedestrian detours around the work site. Areas of the reserve will be temporarily closed while work takes place.

Construction equipment


Equipment to be used during the work activities includes an excavator, tip trucks, generator, jackhammer, vacuum trucks, lighting towers, work vehicles and various hand and power tools.
