Stage 1 Sutherland to Kirrawee

The Sutherland to Cronulla Active Transport Link (SCATL) is a pedestrian and bicycle path between Sutherland and Cronulla to help make walking and bike riding a more convenient, safer and enjoyable transport option.

Construction of Stage 1 is underway and work will be completed progressively between Sutherland and Kirrawee.

Upcoming Activities - President Avenue, Sutherland

Parallel parking spaces on the southern side of President Avenue (between Merton and Eton streets) will be converted to rear to kerb parking, providing 14 new parking spaces.

From **7pm on Wednesday 27 February 2019** up to nine parking spaces in the area will be unavailable for approximately 5 weeks to allow the work to be completed safely.

For the safety of pedestrians and our workers the footpath on the southern side of President Avenue, between Eton and Merton streets, will be closed while the work is being completed. Traffic control will be on site to assist pedestrians around the work site when construction activities are underway. See map overleaf for alternative pedestrian access.

The work will include hammering and saw-cutting to remove the kerb, gutter and pavement and a new footpath. The new parking spaces are expected to be opened in April 2019, weather permitting.

Night work

The majority of work will occur during standard construction hours **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday, and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays**. Some night work will be required outside of these hours to minimise impact on local traffic and for the safety of pedestrians and workers.

Work outside standard hours will be completed between **7pm and 4am on Wednesday 27 and Thursday 28 February** to ensure the safety of workers and residents, and reduce traffic impacts. The work will include saw-cutting concrete and setting up fencing around the work site ahead of the car parking and footpath works. Tools and equipment to be used includes trucks, a concrete-saw, a generator, lighting and various hand and power tools.

Transport for NSW is committed to minimising noise impacts on the community. We switch off equipment when it is not being used, place equipment as far away from properties as possible and monitor our work activities to make sure noise levels are being managed efficiently.

Changes to pedestrian access
