



Sutherland to Cronulla Active Transport Link

The Sutherland to Cronulla Active Transport Link (SCATL) is a pedestrian and bicycle path between Sutherland and Cronulla to help make walking and bike riding a more convenient, safer and enjoyable transport option.

Stage 1 Sutherland to Kirrawee will connect key destinations such as transport interchanges, schools, residential areas and business precincts.

Construction of Stage 1 is underway and will be completed progressively between Sutherland and Kirrawee. Parts of Stage 1 will open as work in each area finishes, with bike riders and pedestrians able to use the whole stage in early 2020.

Continuing work at Sutherland

The site will be closed from 20 December 2019. We wish the community a restful holiday period.

Work will recommence from Monday 6 January 2020 mostly during standard construction hours, which are **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday**, and **8am to 1pm on Saturdays**.

Work will continue in the month of January on President Avenue between Auburn Street and Acacia Road. Work along this section includes excavating, concreting and landscaping.

From Monday 6 January 2020, the next stage of work will commence on President Avenue between Acacia Road and the start of Pollard Park. Work along this section involves excavating, concreting, asphaltting, potholing, landscaping and creating a new pedestrian crossing across Fauna Place. Please see the map overleaf for more detail.

Night work

Some work is required outside standard hours to minimise impacts on local traffic and to improve safety for pedestrians and workers.

Partial lane closures and pedestrian detour will be in place on President Avenue between Acacia Road and Oak Road. Additionally, partial lane closures and pedestrian detours will be in place on President Avenue outside St Patrick's College, between Merton Street and Belmont Street and at Auburn Street and Glencoe Street.

We will require **three weekend nights** between **Friday 10 January 2020** and **Monday 3 February 2020**, from **6pm and 5am** (weather permitting), to build the new pedestrian crossing across Fauna Place. This **work will result in Fauna Place only being accessible via Oak Road**.

We will also require **four night shifts** between **Sunday 19 January** and **Friday 24 January**, from **6pm and 5am** (weather permitting), to complete asphaltting and potholing to continue the path along **President Avenue from Acacia Road to the start of Pollard Park**. Ongoing minor maintenance work will occur throughout the month on Auburn Street, Glencoe Street and along President Avenue between Merton Street and Belmont Street.


Residents in close proximity to the night work will be provided with detailed information closer to the time, and signage will be installed to remind residents and pedestrians of the changes.

This work may be noisy at times, as it includes truck movements, excavating, line marking, concreting and asphaltting. We will implement measures to minimise impacts on the community by completing noisier works as early as possible, switching off equipment when it is not being used, placing equipment as far away from residential properties as possible, and monitoring our work activities to ensure noise levels are being managed effectively.

Temporary traffic and pedestrian changes

There will be pedestrian detours in place while work is occurring between Acacia Road and the start of Pollard Park. Please follow directional signage and assistance of traffic controllers to safe pathways. Traffic changes including lane closures and detours may be in place during work hours to ensure the work zone is safe.

Please keep to the speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.



Keeping the community informed

We will be conducting ongoing landscaping and maintenance work along the new pathway until the completion of the project in early 2020.
