



Sutherland to Cronulla Active Transport Link

COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

The Sutherland to Cronulla Active Transport Link (SCATL) is a pedestrian and bicycle path between Sutherland and Cronulla to help make walking and bike riding a more convenient, safer and enjoyable transport option.

New shared zone

McCubbens Lane, Sutherland, will become a 'shared zone' for pedestrians, motorists and cyclists. The shared zone will be in effect along the full length of McCubbens Lane, between Old Princes Highway and Eton Street, and a new 10 km/h speed will be in force.

McCubbens Lane will remain a one-way street for motorists travelling from west to east, from Old Princes Highway to Eton Street. New street signs will be put in place along McCubbens Lane to inform road users of the changed traffic conditions. The new 10 km/h speed limit will be in force once the signs are in place.

Kiss and ride parking

The kiss and ride parking on Eton Street will be relocated to Flora Street, adjacent to Sutherland Public School from **Monday 13 May**.

Night work on McCubbens Lane and Eton Street, Sutherland

To establish the shared zone we will be completing night works on McCubbens Lane and Eton Street on **Wednesday 15 May** and **Thursday 16 May**. The work will be required outside of standard work hours to minimise impacts on local traffic and for the safety of pedestrians and workers.

McCubbens Lane will have one way lane closures and detours on **Wednesday 15 May**, from 7pm to 12am. While access is still available during these hours, please keep to the speed limits and follow traffic controllers' signs and directions.

There will be a full road closure of McCubbens Lane from 12am to 5am to complete the line marking of the new shared pedestrian and bicycle zone.

Eton Street will have partial closures and detours between Flora Street and Boyle Street, from 7pm to 5am, on **Wednesday 15 May** and **Thursday 16 May**. We will be completing line marking of the new pedestrian crossing and bicycle path.

Night work activities will include movement of trucks, line-marking, excavator movement, saw cutting, concreting and the use of various hand and power tools.

This work may be noisy at times, but we will do everything we can to minimise impacts by completing noisier work as early as possible, switching off equipment when it is not being used, placing equipment as far away from properties as possible, and monitoring our work activities to make sure noise levels are being managed effectively.

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures and detours will be in place and may affect travel times. Please keep to the speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.
