Stage 1 Sutherland to Kirrawee

The Sutherland to Cronulla Active Transport Link (SCATL) is a pedestrian and bicycle path between Sutherland and Cronulla to help make walking and bike riding a more convenient, safer and enjoyable transport option.

Construction of Stage 1, Sutherland to Kirrawee, is underway and each area will open progressively to pedestrians and cyclists as it is completed. All of Stage 1 is expected to be open by early 2020.

Stage 1 will connect key destinations such as transport interchanges, schools, residential areas and business precincts.

Continuing work on Eton Street and President Avenue, Sutherland

Work will continue on Eton Street between McCubbens Lane and President Avenue, and on President Avenue between Eton Street and Glencoe Street. Work includes landscaping, tree removal, line marking, concreting and the relocation of utilities. The work is expected to be complete in January 2020.

From **Saturday 27 July 2019** work will begin on President Avenue, between Glencoe Street and Acacia Road. The work includes tree trimming and removal and construction of the new pedestrian and bicycle pathway. The work will be completed during standard construction hours from **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday**, and **8am to 1pm on Saturdays**.

The work on President Avenue, between Glencoe Street and Acacia Road is expected to be complete in about six weeks, weather permitting. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times and traffic control will be in place when work is in progress. Please see the map overleaf for more detail about the work.

Changes to parking on President Avenue

Approximately 18 parking spaces between Glencoe Street and Acacia Road, will be temporarily unavailable from **Saturday 27 July** for approximately six weeks, to allow work to be carried out safely. The temporary parking changes will be staged one block at a time to reduce the impact on parking in the area.

Night work

Some work will be required outside of standard work hours to minimise impacts on local traffic and to improve the safety of pedestrians and workers.

Night work will be carried out on Auburn Street near President Avenue during **four night shifts** from **6pm to 5am**, between **Thursday 8 August** and **Saturday 24 August**, weather permitting. Night work will include construction of a new pedestrian crossing across Auburn Street and drainage work. There will be partial road closures and detours on President Avenue, between Glencoe Street and Acacia Road while the work takes place.

This work may be noisy at times, as it includes truck movements, saw cutting of the road, jack hammering, concreting and asphaltting. We will implement measures to minimise the impact of our work on the community, such as completing noisier works as early as possible, switching off equipment when it is not being used, placing equipment as far away from properties as possible, and monitoring our work activities to ensure noise levels are being managed effectively.

Residents in close proximity to the night work will be provided more information closer to the time.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. Lane closures and detours will be in place during night work on Auburn Street, and may affect travel times. Please keep to the speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.



Keeping the community informed

We will be completing ongoing landscaping and maintenance work along the new pathway until the completion of the project in January 2020.
