Strathfield to Chullora

COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER 2019

Transport for NSW is upgrading electrical infrastructure as part of the Power Supply Upgrade Program, which is designed to meet expected power requirements for Sydney's future rail network and new fleet of airconditioned trains.

Upcoming construction activities

We will be upgrading and installing power poles and wires in and around the rail corridor between Strathfield and Chullora.

Location	Date	Time	Scope
The Crescent, Homebush	Monday 30 September to Friday 4 October	7am – 5pm	We will be preparing for the installation of power poles. One tree will be removed (subject to approval) to allow for in the installation of a power pole. Up to 20 parking spaces will be temporarily removed to allow these works to be carried out.
Richmond Road, Homebush West	Monday 30 September to Friday 4 October	7am – 5pm	We will be preparing for the installation of power poles. During this time there will be a single lane closure. Traffic control will be in place to provide directions to motorists.
Weeroona Road, Rookwood	Monday 30 September to Friday 4 October	7am – 5pm	We will be preparing for the installation of power poles. During this time there will be a single lane closure. Traffic control will be in place to provide directions to motorists. Up to 10 parking spaces will also be temporarily removed to allow these works to be carried out.

Construction equipment

Equipment to be used includes cherry pickers, excavators, crane truck, generators, light towers, vacuum truck, work vehicles and various hand and power tools.

Transport for NSW is committed to minimising noise impacts on the community. We switch off equipment when it is not being used, place equipment as far away from properties as possible and monitor our work activities to make sure noise levels are being managed effectively.
