



Brookvale pedestrian bridge construction update

January 2020

Details of work activities – Brookvale Pedestrian Bridge

The Brookvale Pedestrian Bridge has recently been opened to the public. To further improve safety and traffic flow at this busy intersection, the signalised pedestrian crossing near William Street will be removed in early 2020, whilst works have progressed to construct the new dedicated left-hand turn northbound into Cross Street, from Pittwater Road.

Construction work will cease over the Christmas and New Year period and will recommence from **Sunday 5 January, 2020**.

Construction activities

Construction activities for the **pedestrian bridge** in January will involve:

- bridge finishing works
- light pole installation
- installation of failsafe gates footings and structure
- traffic control signals
- electrical works
- paving and finishes

Hours of work

Work will occur at the **pedestrian bridge** site located on the map during the following hours:

- **7am to 5pm Monday to Friday**
- **7am to 4pm Saturday**
- up to two nights a week (generally between **Sunday to Thursday**) from **8pm to 6am**.

Night work is undertaken outside of construction hours to ensure the safety of workers, pedestrians and motorists, and to minimise impacts to traffic. Works are dependent on weather and site conditions and are subject to change.

Minimising community impact

Some of the work will be noisy and we try to reduce the noise when we can. Some ways we do this include:

- talking to residents before the work starts, to let them know what to expect
- using barriers and sound blankets to reduce the noise
- the use of squawkers rather than beepers on vehicles
- only using noisy machinery when we absolutely have to
- doing noisy work early in the evening when possible
- directing the noise and lights away from residents when we can

Traffic, parking, bus stop and pedestrian changes

There may be some temporary traffic, parking, bus stop and pedestrian changes to ensure the work zone is safe. There may also be lane closures and pedestrian detours in place during construction. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.

Indicative work calendar – January 2020

Night work will occur in Brookvale (pedestrian bridge works) for up to two nights per week only between the dates indicated in the calendar below. The calendar is indicative only and subject to weather, scope and site conditions. Some specific night work activities and dates will be notified separately to impacted stakeholders seven days prior.

Key Night works - up to two nights within the week indicated below

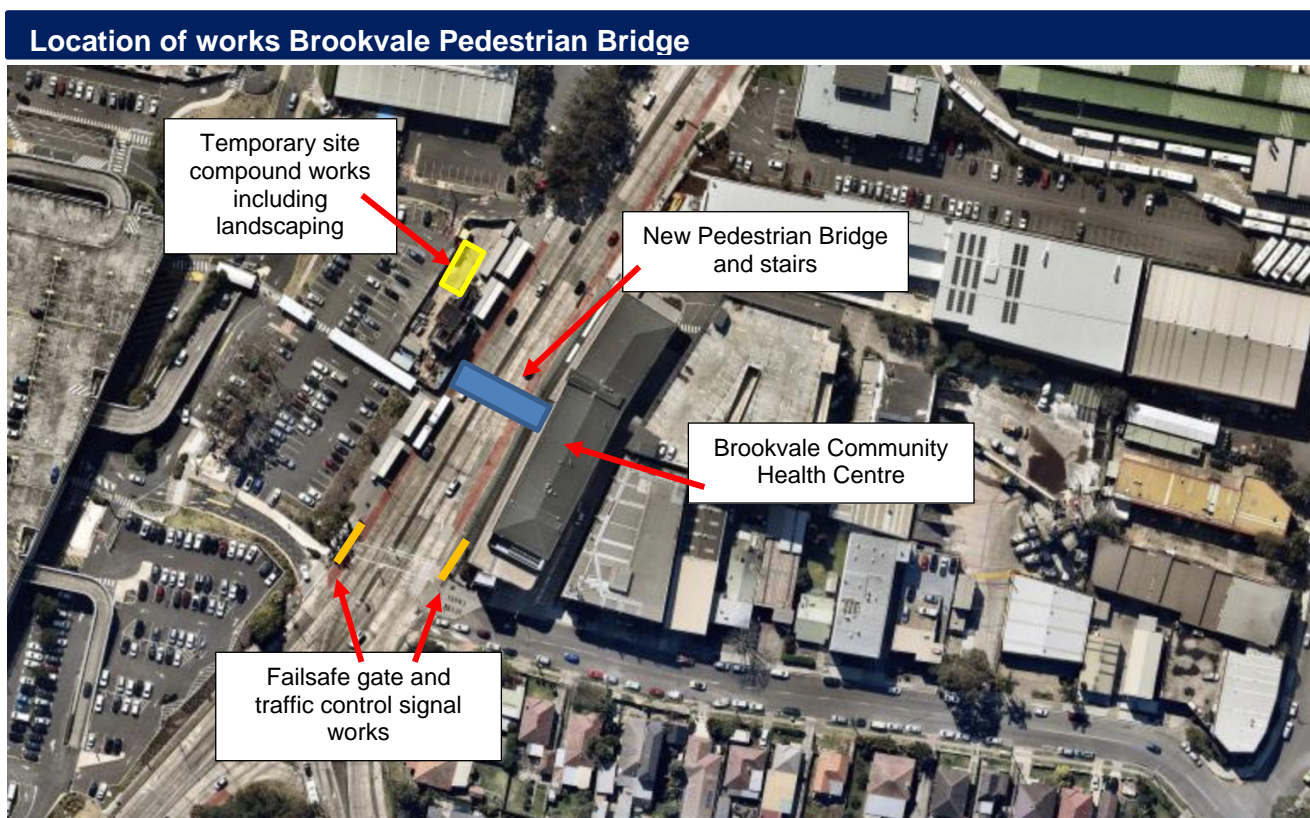
