



Brookvale construction update

February 2020

In Brookvale, further construction activities are required to fully complete works associated with the newly opened pedestrian bridge. Construction also continues to build a new dedicated left-hand turn lane into Cross Street, northbound from Pittwater Road in Brookvale.

In addition to the pedestrian bridge, there will be other safety features and accessible amenities added to further improve pedestrian and cyclist movements in the area including the installation of two fail-safe gates and pedestrian fencing.

Details of work

Construction activities for the **pedestrian bridge** in February will involve:

- removal of existing light pole and installation of a new light pole in new location
- updates to the traffic control signals at the existing at-grade signalised pedestrian crossing
- installation and commissioning of failsafe gates and associated infrastructure at the existing at-grade signalised pedestrian crossing
- paving and pedestrian fencing

Construction activities for the left-hand turn lane into **Cross Street** in February will involve:

- removing redundant utilities
- pavement construction

Hours of work

Work will occur at the **pedestrian bridge** site located on the map during the following hours:

- **7am to 5pm Monday to Friday**
- **7am to 4pm Saturday**
- up to two nights a week (generally between **Sunday to Thursday**) from **8pm to 6am**.

Night work is undertaken outside of construction hours to ensure the safety of workers, pedestrians and motorists, and to minimise impacts to traffic. Works are dependent on weather and site conditions and are subject to change

Work will occur at the **Cross Street** site located on the map during the following hours:

- **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday**
- **8am to 1pm Saturday**
- up to five nights a week (generally between **Monday to Friday**) from **6pm to 5am**

Minimising community impact

Some of the work will be noisy and we try to reduce the noise when we can. Some ways we do this include:

- talking to residents before the work starts, to let them know what to expect
- using barriers and sound blankets to reduce the noise
- the use of squawkers rather than beepers on vehicles
- only using noisy machinery when we absolutely have to
- doing noisy work early in the evening when possible
- directing the noise and lights away from residents when we can

Traffic, parking, bus stop and pedestrian changes

There may be some temporary traffic, parking, bus stop and pedestrian changes to ensure the work zone is safe. There may also be lane closures, footpath closures and pedestrian detours in place during construction. Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.

Indicative work calendar Cross Street – February 2020

Night work will occur in Brookvale for up to five nights per week for the left turn into Cross Street works, generally between Monday to Friday. The calendar is indicative only and works may not always occur for the five consecutive nights, subject to weather, scope and site conditions. Some specific night work activities will be notified separately to impacted stakeholders seven days prior.

- Monday 17 February – Wednesday 19 February 2020 (please note the third night will be non-noisy night work)

If work cannot be completed on these dates it will occur on Wednesday 26 February and Thursday 27 February.
