

Transport Access Program

Hawkesbury River Station Upgrade

Project update

December 2020

The NSW Government is improving accessibility at Hawkesbury River Station. The upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering modern, safe and accessible infrastructure.

Early work commenced in November 2019.

Upcoming work

Work will continue in December and includes:

- road and footpath work on Dangar Road including asphaltting and line marking
- construction of a garden bed in McKell Park around the monument
- installing new signs in the station precinct
- completing the new power supply connection to the station on Dangar Road.

Equipment to be used includes small excavators, demolition saws, tipper trucks, heavy vehicles, concrete and asphalt delivery trucks, road profiler, asphalt paver, rollers, elevated work platform, power pole handling crane and lighting towers.

Work will mostly be carried out during standard construction hours, which is 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 7am to 6pm Saturday.

Night work Tuesday 15 December and Wednesday 16 December 2020

The new power supply for Hawkesbury River Station needs to be connected when the station is not in operation. This work is scheduled to take place on **Tuesday 15 December and Wednesday 16 December 2020 from 1am to 5am** each day. The work is not expected to be noisy.

Traffic, pedestrian and parking changes

On 16 November 2020, three car spaces in the Dangar Road car park were permanently closed to create one new accessible car space. The new accessible car space will open to holders of a Mobility Parking Scheme permit from **9 December 2020**.

From **30 November to 11 December 2020**, the bus stop on Dangar Road will be temporarily relocated to Brooklyn Road in front of The Angler's Rest. Four car spaces will be temporarily unavailable in this location to allow for the temporary relocation of the bus stop. Signs are in place to assist bus passengers.

Pedestrian detours will be in place until **4 December 2020**. From **7 December 2020**, pedestrians accessing the Ferry Wharf will use the new footpath on the northern side of Dangar Road.

Signs and traffic control will be in place to assist road users and pedestrians.
