## Lapstone Station Upgrade

**Project update**

**June to August 2020**



The Lapstone Station Upgrade is being delivered as part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering accessible, modern, secure and integrated transport infrastructure.

### Project overview

Transport for NSW is upgrading Lapstone Station to make it easier for everyone to access, including people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

The project includes a new lift and upgraded ramp, upgrades to the station building including improved access to the waiting room and station facilities, new unisex ambulant and a family accessible toilet, new wayfinding signage and upgrades to station security and communication systems.

Work is expected to be completed in late 2021.

### Upcoming work and site establishment

Site establishment work will begin from Monday 22 June 2020 and activities include:

- installing temporary site compound, connecting temporary electrical and water services and installing fencing at the road reserve on the corner of Dawes Place and Explorers Road and work areas around the station
- trimming vegetation
- electrical and water service relocation on the station platform and surrounding precinct
- undertaking surveying and investigation work for the new lift, ramps and platform building

- preparation work for the new lift, including ground clearance, lift pit excavation, rock bolting, waterproofing and concreting
- preparation work for the new ramp, including ground clearance, excavation and spoil removal
- demolishing and reconfiguring sections of platform building.

Equipment which will be used during this work includes: mobile crane, small drilling rig, excavators, surveying equipment, delivery/concrete trucks, concrete pumps, construction trucks, power and hand tools. Please see the map overleaf for further detail including work areas.

## Construction hours

To support the industry and continue the delivery of critical infrastructure, the NSW Government has introduced new rules allowing construction sites to operate on weekends and public holidays.

**Standard construction hours are now 7am to 6pm every day, including public holidays.** These changes have been made to facilitate social distancing on construction sites and support the health and wellbeing of workers.

We understand extending construction hours to include weekends and public holidays may cause disruption for the community but all efforts will be made to minimise impacts where possible and ensure strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management are adhered to.

We will notify nearby residents and businesses in advance if we need to work outside these times.

Thank you for your patience as work continues on important transport infrastructure across NSW.

## Temporary traffic, access and parking changes

Throughout our work, there may be occasional temporary traffic and access changes surrounding Lapstone Station on Explorers Road or Leonay fire trail including **single lane road closures and/or temporary parking removal** to accommodate large vehicles undertaking construction work and to enable removal of rock/spoil from the lift work areas.

**From late July 2020** access to the station via the existing public footpath between 211 and 215 Explorers Lane will be closed for approximately 12 months while construction work is underway. Access to residential properties from Explorers Road using the footpath will be maintained.

Traffic control and signage will be in place to help pedestrians and motorists with all temporary changes.

## Night work during July and August

From time to time we may need to conduct work at night or during scheduled track work periods to ensure the safety of our workers.

During July and August we are planning to connect a temporary power supply to the station construction site. Night work will be carried out from midnight to 4am for up to two nights. Work will be carried out with hand tools only to minimise noise impacts for nearby residents.








## Temporary changes to station toilets

The existing female and male toilets in the station building will be temporarily closed from **mid-August 2020** until May 2021 to allow for refurbishment work at the station building. A temporary unisex toilet will be available for use on Platform 1 (Glenbrook end) during this time. The temporary toilet will be available across the same times as the existing toilet facilities.

Signage will be in place in advance to help with these temporary changes.
