



# Transport Access Program

## Mittagong Station Upgrade

**Community Notification**

**July 2020**

The upgrade at Mittagong Station is being delivered as part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering accessible, modern, secure and integrated transport infrastructure across the state.

### Upcoming work

Work activities in July will include:

- installation of structural steel for the lift shaft
- continued work on the new light poles
- continued construction of the new electrical cabinets
- electrical services work in and around the station buildings
- starting upgrade work on the footbridge stairs and the station forecourts.

Equipment to be used will include excavator, dump truck, crane truck, 130-tonne and 60-tonne cranes, elevated work platform, power tools and hand tools.

### Temporary changes on Regent Street

From Monday 6 July, a temporary work zone will be set up on the Regent Street forecourt. The bus stops on Regent Street will be relocated further west (please see map overleaf). Up to six parking spaces are temporarily unavailable in the Regent Street commuter car park. The temporary access and parking changes on Railway Parade will remain in place. These changes will be in place for approximately two months to allow for lighting and lift installation work to be completed safely.

### Temporary changes to pedestrian and parking access

From Monday 6 July, access to the station from Regent Street will be via the western side (Bowral end) of the station building. Access to the commuter car park will be maintained from the western entry on Regent Street.

Access from Railway Parade will also be temporarily changed during this time, with customers directed to a temporary pedestrian ramp to enter the station. These access changes will be in place for approximately two months. Signage will be in place to assist customers.

### Weekend work

For the safety of staff and customers, the pedestrian footbridge will be closed on the weekend of 25 and 26 July while we complete work on the new lift. Pedestrian access across the rail line will be via the level crossing opposite Princes Street.

From 12pm Saturday 25 July to 12pm Sunday 26 July 2020, work will take place to install the steel portions of the lift shafts. A 130-tonne crane will be on site to lift the structure into the place. The pedestrian footbridge will be closed during this time. To minimise any disruption to public transport customers and for the safety of our workers, the majority of the lift work is being planned between 12am and 4am when trains are not running.



## Extended construction hours

To support the industry and continue the delivery of critical infrastructure, the NSW Government has introduced new rules allowing construction sites to operate on weekends and public holidays. Standard construction hours are now 7am to 6pm every day, including public holidays. These changes have been made to facilitate social distancing on construction sites and support the health and wellbeing of workers.

Transport for NSW understands extending construction hours to weekends and public holidays may cause disruption for the community and all efforts will be made to minimise impacts where possible and ensure strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management are adhered to.
