Wahroonga Station Upgrade

Project update

January 2021

Transport for NSW is upgrading Wahroonga Station to provide a station precinct that is accessible to those with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

The upgrade is being delivered as part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering accessible, modern, secure and integrated transport infrastructure across the state.

Site establishment and early work activities are currently underway with major construction due to commence in January 2021.

Upcoming work

Work will continue in January and includes:

- service and utility investigations
- · relocation of electrical and communication services
- vegetation clearing and trimming
- piling work for the lift shaft.

Equipment to be used includes surveying equipment, vacuum trucks, concrete pumps, tipper trucks, excavators, cranes, light vehicles and hand tools.

Night work 25, 27 and 28 January 2021

For the safety of our workers, pedestrians and motorists, work will take place over 3 nights on **Monday 25**, **Wednesday 27 and Thursday 28 January 2021** between **6pm** and **7am**.

Some of this work will take place in the rail corridor and needs to be carried out during a scheduled Sydney Trains track work period when trains aren't running and the station is closed.

The work will include:

- delivery of plant and equipment to the work site
- excavation and water extraction at the location of the lift shaft
- · service and utility investigations
- stockpiling materials
- concrete pouring.

Equipment to be used includes a vacuum truck, piling rigs, concrete pumps, mini loaders and hand tools. Please see the map below for the location of work areas.

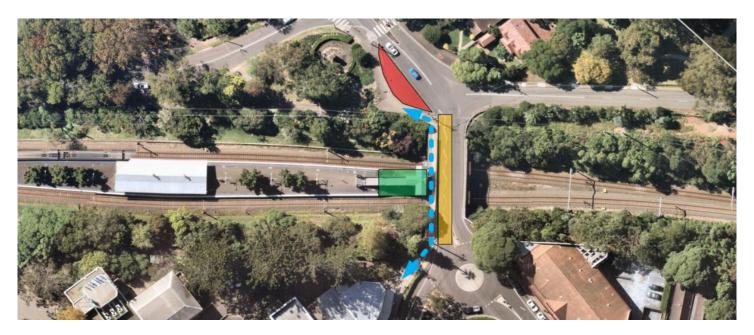
This work will be noisy at times. Wherever possible, measures to reduce noise will be implemented including turning equipment off when not in use, positioning equipment as far away from residences as possible, monitoring noise, using non-tonal reversing beepers and stopping work for respite periods.

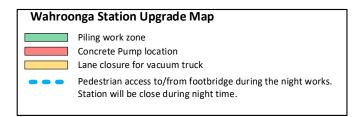
