Warrawee Station Upgrade

Project update

July 2020

The NSW Government is improving accessibility at Warrawee Station. Warrawee Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, an initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering modern, safe, and accessible infrastructure.

The upgrade will provide a station that is accessible to those with a disability, limited mobility, carers/parents with prams and customers with luggage.

Upcoming work

Work will continue in July and will include:

- footpath and road works on Warrawee Avenue to be completed
- completing electrical and communication services to new lift, canopies and station including testing and commissioning
- completing assembly of the new lift
- completing the new family accessible toilet and unisex ambulant toilet
- installing the new bike shelter on Heydon Avenue
- installing new screens to the pedestrian footbridge
- Australia Post reinstating the post box on Warrawee Avenue.

Equipment

Equipment to be used may include cranes, excavators, rollers, asphalt paving plant, heavy and light vehicles, concrete delivery trucks, small tools including grinders, concrete saws, generators and various hand tools.

Weekend work: 18 and 19 July 2020

From **2am Saturday 18 July to midnight Sunday 19 July 2020**, work will be carried out to replace the asphalt surface on the platform, remove the temporary toilet from the platform and install new screens on the pedestrian footbridge.

The work will be completed during a scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork weekend to enhance safety and minimise disruption to customers and the community. No train services will operate and the station will be closed during this time.

There may be some noise associated with this work and we understand this may be disruptive at times. We apologise for the inconvenience and will aim to minimise impacts by:

- turning machinery off when not in use
- using non-tonal reversing beepers on all machinery
- minimising equipment operating at any one time
- conducting regular noise monitoring.

Traffic and parking changes

Upgrades to the footpath near the Warrawee Avenue station entrance began in late June and will be completed in July. There will be restricted access to the Warrawee Avenue kiss and ride zone during this time. For pick up and drop off, customers are encouraged to use the new kiss and ride zone on Heydon Avenue.

Pedestrian access to the station from Warrawee Avenue and Heydon Avenue will be maintained except during the scheduled trackwork weekend on 18 and 19 July 2020 when the station will be closed. However, the footbridge will remain open for those wishing to cross the rail line.

Traffic controllers will be in place to assist with changes to pedestrian and vehicle movements.

Access to amenities

The new family accessible toilet and unisex ambulant toilet will be completed in July. The temporary toilet facilities that have been available at the north end of the platform will be removed during the scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork weekend on 18 and 19 July 2020.

New construction hours

Under new rules introduced by the NSW Government to support the construction industry during the COVID-19 situation, some construction sites can now operate on weekends and public holidays.

Under the new Order, **standard construction hours are now 7am to 6pm every day, including public holidays.**

The *Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID-19 Development – Construction Work Days) Order 2020* will continue for up to six months and all changes to the Order will be communicated accordingly.

It enables workers to abide by social distancing rules while keeping construction projects progressing by allowing building work to be spread across more days of the week.

The Warrawee project team may use the extended hours during the month of July.
