Wye Station Upgrade

Project Update

March 2020

March work

Construction on the Wye Station Upgrade is progressing well, with upgrades to the station facilities and construction of the lift shaft continuing throughout March.

Construction activities in March include:

- building a new station access ramp and retaining walls on Wye Road
- internal fit out of the new accessible station toilets
- floor tiling and installation of new seating in the waiting room
- installation of new fencing around the station precinct.

Equipment to be used includes excavators, elevated work platforms, concrete trucks, concrete pumps, excavators, power and hand tools.

Temporary changes to Wye Road 'Kiss and Ride' zone

The 'Kiss and Ride' zone on Wye Road will be temporarily relocated near the existing Wye Road bus stop while footpath upgrades are carried out at the station entry during March. Traffic control will be in place to assist pedestrians and motorists with these changes.

Weekend work – Saturday 14 and Sunday 15 March

Work will be carried out continuously from **5am Saturday 14 March** until **10pm Sunday 15 March 2020**.

Activities include using a large mobile crane to:

- install lift shaft canopies and screens to lifts
- install new stairs to access Platform 1 from the footbridge.

Other work includes installing underground services along the platform and station electrical works.

Equipment to be used includes large mobile cranes, truck mounted cranes, delivery trucks, elevated work platforms, excavators, power and hand tools. The construction equipment will be positioned as far away from residential areas as possible with regular respite periods during any noisy work.

This work has been planned to coincide with a scheduled track work weekend when **no train services will operate**.

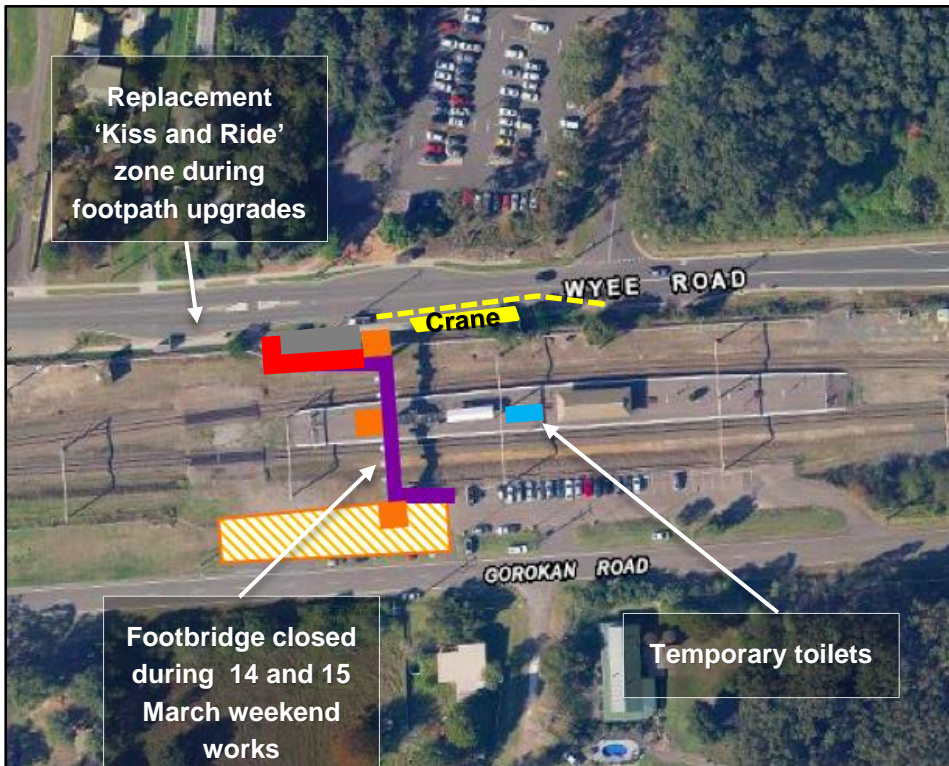

Motorist and pedestrian detours

To safely operate the crane, temporary vehicle and pedestrian access changes will be in place during the work on Wyee Road from **5am Saturday 14 March until 10pm Sunday 15 March 2020**. Traffic control and signage will be used to assist pedestrians and motorists with the changes. See the map below for more information.

Standard construction hours

Work will be carried out during standard construction hours, **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday**, and **8am to 1pm, Saturday**. Notifications of any work occurring outside of these standard hours will be given prior to work commencing.

Toilet and waiting room closure

The existing toilets and waiting room on Platform 2 remain closed for refurbishment and are expected to re-open in April 2020. Two temporary unisex toilets are located on Platform 2 at the rear of the existing building.
