

Night works around the temporary bus interchange, St Marys starting on Sunday 5 December 2021

Works are underway by Transport for NSW to build a temporary bus interchange within the former Veness Place car park on Station Street to enable construction of the Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport. The temporary bus interchange will open in early 2022. To facilitate this work, the taxi rank has moved to Queen Street, the kiss and ride has moved to Nariel Street and the N70 bus stand now operates from one stand on the northern side of Station Street.

What happens next?

We will continue general construction, road and drainage works in the area surrounding the temporary bus interchange (see map below). Works will also be carried out at night to minimise traffic disruption.



1 Station Street works

We will be investigating existing pipes, cables, roads and footpaths, which will involve minimal digging and testing. We will also be installing services and utilities including new gas lines, street lights and CCTV, and installing a new stormwater drainage pipe on the southern side of Station Street between the temporary bus interchange entrance and Lethbridge Street. Work involves excavating the road and footpath, laying pipe, infilling, installing new kerbing, guttering and a footpath, and asphaltting the road with new line marking. Concrete and water-filled road barriers have been installed on Station Street for safety purposes to section off where we will be working.

Traffic controls will be in place to prevent residents parking when work is taking place. We kindly ask residents and visitors to assist us in making sure **no cars are parked on the southern side of Station Street between 6pm and 6am Sunday to Thursday nights**. We thank you for your patience and understanding.

2 Temporary Bus Interchange

Construction work will continue for the temporary bus interchange including excavation of the former car park, concrete pours, asphaltting and line marking. Access to the footpath on the southern side of Station Street from the temporary bus interchange to Lethbridge Street may be interrupted at times but traffic controls will be in place.

3 Station Street truck and equipment holding bay

We will be delivering equipment and materials to the laydown area located at 1a Station Street, adjacent to the existing bus interchange.

4 East Lane at Phillip Street

We will be installing a raised footpath across East Lane near Phillip Street. This work involves removing the existing footpath, excavating the road, pouring concrete and installing new line marking. Access to driveways and buildings on East Lane will be maintained but may be interrupted during night works. Utility services will be maintained, and garbage collections and deliveries on both East Lane and Phillip Street will be possible.

5 Queen Street

We will be installing a new, raised pedestrian crossing on Queen Street, north of the intersection at Nariel Street. This work includes removing the existing road, kerb and guttering, laying formwork, concrete pours, asphaltting, and reinstating kerbing and guttering, installing pram ramps and footpaths with new line marking and signage.

How will the work affect you?

Equipment used for this work includes but is not limited to: vacuum excavation trucks, road-saws, jack hammers, bobcats (front-end loaders), excavators, rigid trucks, concrete trucks, rollers, water trucks, asphalt pavers and mobile cranes.

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. This may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.

There will be minor traffic disruptions and an increase in light and construction vehicles throughout the period of works with traffic control measures in place. Access to driveways and buildings will be maintained but may be interrupted during night works. Utility services will be maintained and garbage collections and deliveries will be possible.

To minimise noise and dust impacts we have put in place the following measures:

- a work schedule that provides respite times of 2 hours between the start of day and night shifts, and 2 consecutive weekend nights – Fridays and Saturdays – without any night works
- installing construction fencing and shade cloth around the main construction site with regular hosing-down of sites to reduce dust
- stopping noisier work, such as saw-cutting concrete or using hammer plates on road surfaces, at night by 11pm and using noise curtains, where feasible, for mobile or temporary works

Our work schedule

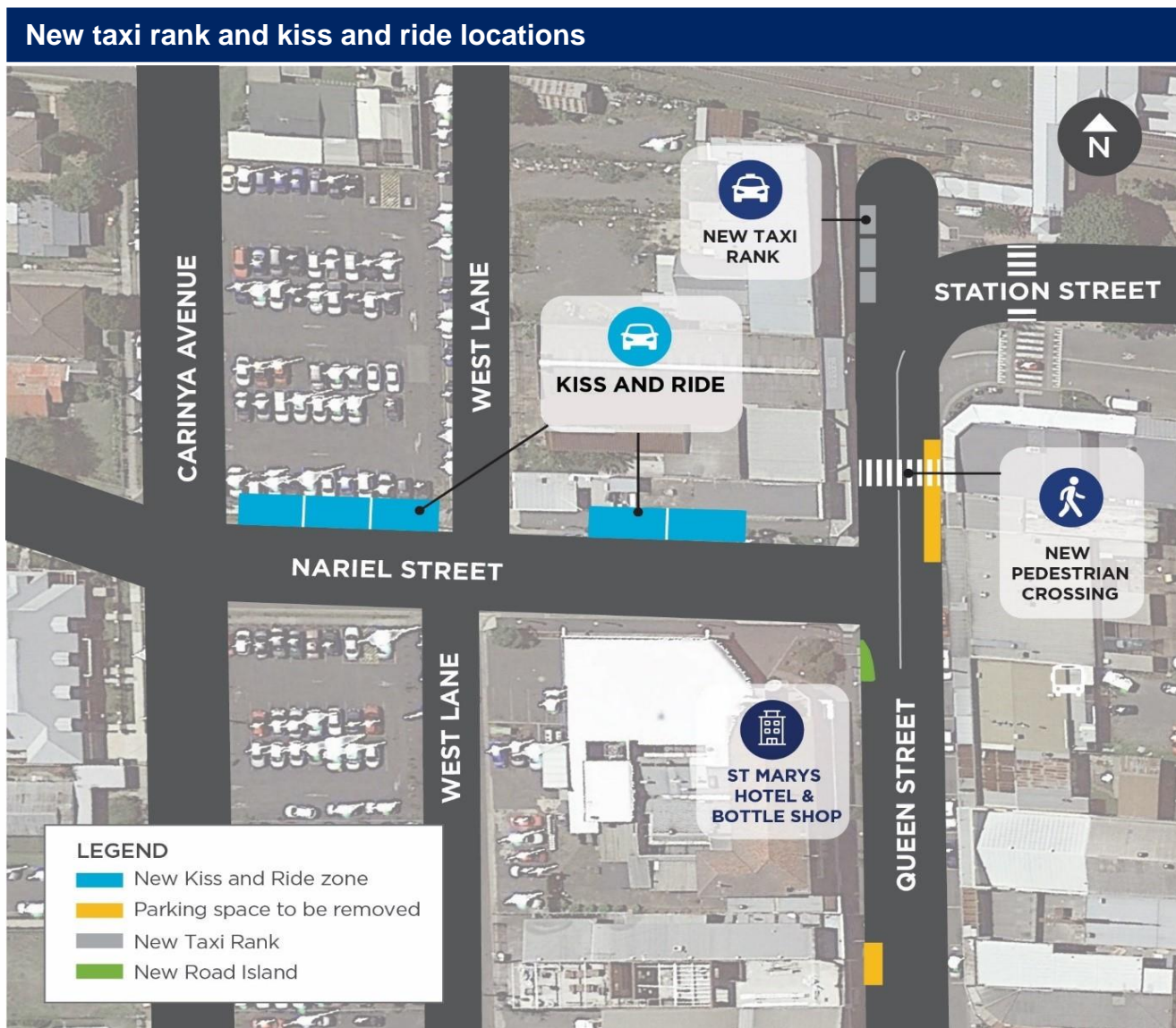
Our standard work hours will be **Monday to Sunday from 7am to 6pm**. On weekends, high noise activities will only take place on Saturdays between 8am and 1pm.

Night works will take place over a 3 week period from Sunday 5 December until Thursday 23 December. Our night work hours will be **Sunday to Thursday nights from 8pm to 5am**. Night work will not take place on Friday and Saturday nights.

These works will be undertaken in accordance with Public Health Orders and a COVIDSafe plan is in place. Please note the weather may impact our planned dates of work and require some scheduling flexibility or additional days' work. We will continue to keep the community informed of construction plans and provide another update in December.

Important update - Taxi rank and kiss and ride have moved

The taxi rank is now operating on Queen Street and the kiss and ride on Nariel Street. We would like to remind residents that for the safety of pedestrians and vehicles and to maintain traffic flow **the Queen Street taxi rank is for the exclusive use of taxis at all times of the day and night**. Residents who are picking up and dropping off train passengers must use the kiss and ride on Nariel Street.
