


Summer and night works around the temporary bus interchange, St Marys from Tuesday 4 January 2022

Works are underway by Transport for NSW to build a temporary bus interchange within the former Veness Place car park on Station Street to enable construction of the Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport. The temporary bus interchange will open in early 2022.

What happens next?

We will continue general construction, road and drainage works in the area surrounding the temporary bus interchange (**see map**) except for the holiday closure periods as outlined below. Works will also be carried out at night to minimise traffic disruption.



1 Station Street works

Works will continue and include:

- installing a new stormwater drainage pipe along the southern side of Station Street between the temporary bus interchange entrance and Lethbridge Street
- installing services and utilities including new gas lines, street lighting and CCTV

Night works are planned to take place at this site from **Tuesday 4 January** through to **Thursday 3 February 2022**, except for the Australia Day public holiday as outlined below.

Traffic controls will be in place to prevent residents parking when work is taking place. We kindly ask residents and visitors to assist us by **not parking vehicles on the southern side of Station Street between 6pm and 6am Sunday to Thursday nights**. We thank you for your patience and understanding.



2 Temporary Bus Interchange

Works will continue and include:

- relocating and installing new underground utility services
- excavation works and ground surface levelling
- · concrete pours and asphalting

Night works are planned to take place at this site from **Tuesday 4 January** through to **Thursday 3 February 2022**, except for the Australia Day public holiday as outlined below.

3 Station Street truck and equipment holding bay

We will continue to deliver equipment and materials to the holding bay located at 1a Station Street, next to the existing bus interchange.

4 East Lane at Phillip Street

Works at this site are planned to start on **Monday 10 January 2022** and include:

- excavating the road and constructing a raised footpath
- installing new pipes and cables
- road line marking and installing signage

Night works are planned to take place from Monday 10 January through to Thursday 20 January 2022.

Access to driveways and buildings on East Lane will be maintained but may be interrupted during night works. Utility services will be maintained, and garbage collections and deliveries on both East Lane and Phillip Street will be possible.

5 Queen Street pedestrian crossing between Nariel and Station Street

Works at this site are planned to start on **Sunday 16 January 2022** and include:

- excavating the road and constructing a raised pedestrian crossing with pram ramps
- installing new kerbing and guttering
- road line marking and installing signage

Night works are planned to take place from **Sunday 16 January** through to **Thursday 3 February 2022**, except for the Australia Day public holiday as outlined below.

How will the work affect you?

Equipment used for this work includes but is not limited to vacuum excavation trucks, road-saws, jack hammers, bobcats (front-end loaders), excavators, rigid trucks, concrete trucks, rollers, water trucks, asphalt pavers and mobile cranes.

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. This may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.

There will be minor traffic disruptions and an increase in light and construction vehicles throughout the period of works with traffic control measures in place.

To minimise noise and dust impacts we have put in place the following measures:

- a work schedule that provides respite times of 2 hours between day and night shifts, and 2 consecutive weekend nights Fridays and Saturdays without any night works
- installing construction fencing and shade cloth around the main construction site with regular hosing-down of sites to reduce dust
- stopping noisier work, such as saw-cutting concrete or using hammer plates on road surfaces, at night by midnight and using noise curtains, where feasible, for mobile or temporary works

Our work schedules

Our standard work hours will be **Monday to Sunday from 7am to 6pm**. On weekends, high noise activities will only take place on Saturdays between 8am and 1pm.

Our night work hours will be **Sunday to Thursday nights from 8pm to 5am**. Night works will not take place on Friday and Saturday nights. We will finish high noise works by midnight whenever possible.

These works will be undertaken in accordance with Public Health Orders and a COVID Safe plan is in place. Please note the weather and site conditions may impact our planned dates of work and require some scheduling flexibility or additional days' work. We will continue to keep the community informed of construction plans and provide a project update in February 2022.

Construction during Christmas, New Year and Australia Day

Christmas and New Year: construction sites will close over the Christmas and New Year holiday period from 6pm Friday 24 December 2021 until 7am Tuesday 4 January 2022.

Australia Day: construction sites will be closed for the Australia Day public holiday from 6pm Tuesday 25 January until 7am Thursday 27 January 2022.

While constructions sites are closed, periodic checks will take place to ensure all sites and work areas are secure and maintained.
