Transport for NSW is rolling out new technology to upgrade Sydney's rail network and introducing modern signalling as part of the Digital Systems Program.

Part of 'More Trains, More Services', the Digital Systems Program will replace current signalling and train control technology with modern, internationally proven, intelligent systems. It will help improve reliability and increase capacity on Sydney's railways once implemented widely across the network.

Work activity

Ongoing project work involves installing new track infrastructure inside the rail corridor along the Eastern Suburbs Line from Erskineville to Bondi Junction. In coming weeks, you may notice activities including the installation and extension of existing power cable trays.

These works are in line with current Public Health Orders and a COVID-19 Safe Plan is in place for all activity in the work area, including masks and QR codes.

Upcoming work in your area

Between 4am and 8pm on Saturday 27 November and 4am and 8pm on Sunday 28 November we will be working inside the rail corridor, including near the rail tunnel entrances at Edgecliff Road and Wallaroy Road, Woollahra. Workers will access the corridor from Weeroona Avenue, Woollahra. Activity will involve cabling works.

The work in your area will not be continuous. Every effort will be made to keep noisy works to a minimum and reduce impacts to the community whenever possible.

What you may notice

Equipment used during the work activity will include a tipper truck, a crane truck, lighting towers, power tools and hand tools such as drills and a vacuum.


