Project update

Transport for NSW is committed to delivering up to 2,000 additional commuter parking spaces for commuters using Edmondson Park Station to provide you with more convenient access to public transport and reduce congestion on our roads.

In 2020, planning approval was granted to construct a new multi-storey car park with ground plus five levels providing up to 1,000 additional parking spaces to the south of Edmondson Park Station.

Detailed design has identified that a further 250 parking spaces can be delivered in a ground plus five level car park meaning more parking will be available for commuters bringing the total parking spaces to the south of Edmondson Park Station to 1,250.

Project status and revised opening date

We have commenced construction on the fifth level, which will deliver a further much needed 250 commuter parking spaces in the new multi-storey car park, providing around 1,250 additional commuter car parking spaces in the new commuter car park. Due to the construction of these additional spaces and weather impacts the car park is now planned to be opened by late 2021.

Construction progress update

In June 2021, concrete pours for level five commenced and construction of level five slabs was completed. Electrical and plumbing installation work are progressing. Fit out works have also commenced with the installation of guard rails, façade brackets and internal painting.

Upcoming construction work

During July 2021, the following work will occur on the new multi-storey car park:

- Construction of load bearing walls and columns
- Construction of stairs and lift cores
- Installation of perimeter scaffold for level five
- Plumbing and electrical work within the building
- High voltage electrical work
- Removal of formwork from lower floors
- Commencement of façade installation
- Commencement of structural steel roof
- Complete work to connect the multi-storey car park to water services along MacDonald Road
- Decommission and removal of tower crane scheduled for late July 2021

From **Monday 12 July - Sunday 25 October** 2021 a temporary site compound will be set up on the western side of Sergeant Street to allow for underground services excavation and landscaping works to occur safely (see below map).

Construction hours

Standard construction hours are now **7am to 6pm Monday to Saturday**. This is to facilitate social distancing on construction sites and support the health and wellbeing of workers.

Changes to traffic during major concrete pour days

In order to carry out the concrete pours safely, one lane will be closed on Henderson Road adjacent to the work site. Traffic control and signage will be in place to support motorists and pedestrians with the change in traffic arrangements.

Façade design

Acclaimed artist Shane Smithers has developed the façade design for the Edmondson Park Commuter Car Park to celebrate the traditional Cumberland Woodland of what is now Western Sydney.

The north, south and western faces of the building reflect the remnant of woodland to the west of the Town Centre, with a modern pixelated steel design of the Cumberland Woodland. By contrast, the eastern face invites the telling of a different story, not of the replacement of the woodland on the site, but of its urban regeneration. Perforated metal panels feature a unique artwork depicting the Great Cumberland Woodland trees against a background of stylized houses, rooflines and structures. The roots of the foreground trees plunge into mother earth, with the trunks, branches and leaves rising up to touch father sky, uniting the regenerative forces of our mother and father. For Aboriginal people, this connection represents the coming together of the forces of creation, birth, rebirth and regeneration.
