## Erskineville Station Upgrade

**COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION**

**APRIL 2021**

The Erskineville Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

To help inform the design for the proposed Erskineville Station Upgrade, site and underground service investigations and service scanning will take place in and around the station. This involves investigative boreholes, service identification and surveying in and around the station. The investigations will be undertaken between **8am and 6pm Saturday 17 April 2021**.

### What you may notice

Plant and machinery will access the rail corridor via the rail access gates on Concord Street between King Street and Bray Street, Erskineville.

Equipment to be used during these investigations will include a vacuum truck, surveying equipment, compactor, work vehicles, hand and powered tools.

Some of this work may be noisy at times however, we will make every effort to minimise the impact to nearby residents and businesses.
