## Erskineville Station Upgrade

### COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

JULY 2021

The Erskineville Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

### Mid-week work between 1 July and 30 July

Following planning approval to deliver an accessible station, early works and site establishment will be undertaken **from 1 July to 30 July (weekdays only) between 7am and 6pm**. This include:

- Site investigations, earthworks and tree removal adjacent to Platforms 1 and 4
- In-ground preparation work for future installation of new power cables and services adjacent to and on Platforms 1 and 4
- Removing station furniture at the southern end of the platform in preparation for the new footbridge
- Establishment of site offices at Erskineville Station, adjacent to Platform 1
- Installation of hoarding and temporary fencing on the station platforms – at the south end of all platforms and north end of Platform 1 by the stairs
- Excavation and stabilisation of embankment adjacent to north end of Platform 1
- Subject to approval - changes to the traffic island, footpath kerb and fencing on Swanson Street road bridge to enable site access.

### Upcoming weekend work

Dates	Work hours	Location	Activities
<b>Saturday 17 July to Sunday 18 July</b>	Between 6am and 6pm	At Erskineville Station and inside the rail corridor.	Relocation of various services and cables. The services being relocated are related to the rail network and will not impact residential properties. <b>Note: trains will not be running this weekend.</b>
<b>Saturday 31 July to Sunday 1 August</b>	From 5am Saturday to midnight Sunday	Platforms 1, 2 and 3	Excavation, piling, and installation of hoarding with lighting. <b>Note: trains will be running this weekend on Platforms 3 and 4</b>

## What to expect

- Plant and machinery will access the rail corridor via the rail access gate on Concord Street between King Street and Bray Street.
- Equipment used throughout the month includes; vacuum truck, piling rig, road saw, crane, crane truck, excavators, hi-rail trucks, concrete pumps, hi-rail crane, chainsaw, chipper, and various hand and power tools.

While work is undertaken along Bridge Street for the new station entrance and footbridge, there will be **temporary closures of the footpath and bicycle lane**. Traffic and pedestrian control will be in place during these times to help people move safely around the area.
