Erskineville Station Upgrade

The Erskineville Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

Progress update

Piling and excavation for the new lifts and footbridge continued throughout October. Stabilisation of the embankment adjacent to Platform 1 started this month.

We're going online

To help reduce our paper footprint in the community we're moving our construction updates to **online only**. This will be the last paper construction update you will receive about the Erskineville Station Upgrade. All future updates will be available on the project webpage at the end of each month.

We will still notify residents on Bridge Street and George Street in advance of all out-of-hours work. We may also notify the wider community from time to time if we have any important activities coming up.

Out of hours weekend work in November

We are working **three weekends** this month on Platforms 1, 2, 3 and 4.

From 11.59pm on Friday 12 November to 4am on Monday 15 November we will be working around the clock on the platforms. Work includes:

- installing services and drainage
- excavating and concreting footings and columns for the new canopy
- removing materials from site
- stockpiling materials within the rail corridor off Railway Parade.

From 11.59pm on Friday 19 November to 4am on Monday 22 November we will be working around the clock on the platforms. Work includes:

- installing reinforced footbridge columns
- pouring concrete
- installing columns
- working on the overhead wiring
- removing materials from site.

From 11.59pm on Friday 26 November to 4am on Monday 29 November we will be working around the clock on the platforms. Work includes:

- · installing services and drainage
- excavating and concreting footings and columns for new canopy
- · removing materials from site

stockpiling materials within the rail corridor off Railway Parade.

Mid-week day work

Weekly work during the day will include:

- piling, concreting and excavating
- reinforcing the site entrance embankment
- tree removal next to Platform 1 and 4
- replacing the perimeter fence next to Platform 4
- working within the station buildings
- cleaning and clearing materials
- installing services and drainage around the station.

Bridge Street footpath and cyclepath

Throughout October there will be intermittent closures of the footpath on Bridge Street, next to Platform 4. This is for the safe parking of a concrete truck and a pump and vacuum truck for work on Platform 4.

Please use the other footpath. Cyclists will also be asked to dismount to safely enter Bridge Street under traffic control measures.

Traffic Island removal

To allow work vehicles to turn safely into the worksite, the traffic island opposite the Swanson Street rail access gate, to the west of the station entrance will be temporarily removed.

What to expect

Throughout November, other Transport projects will also be working in and around the station.

We will be implementing noise reduction measures like using noise blankets, turning equipment off when not in use and placing equipment as far from properties as possible. Construction lighting will be turned away from properties or turned off when not required to help reduce light spill.

Equipment to be used throughout November includes: excavator, piling rig, road saw, tipper truck, concrete truck and pumps, vacuum truck, grinder, dump truck, handheld breaker, chainsaw, chipper, task lighting, lighting towers generators, and various hand and power tools.

There will also be deliveries and removal of plant and materials from site via Bridge Street, Swanson Street, Railway Parade, Macdonaldtown and Eveleigh Yard rail access gates. Deliveries will be made under traffic and pedestrian control measures.

The Erskineville Station Upgrade team is committed to following the advice of the NSW Government, abiding to all COVID-19 safe practices.
