Erskineville Station Upgrade

The Erskineville Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

Progress update

Piling and excavation for the new lifts and footbridge continued throughout September. The new site offices were installed adjacent to Platform 1.

Out of hours weekend work in October

We are working two weekends this month on Platforms 1, 2 and 3 with a third weekend as contingency.

From 11.59pm on Friday 8 October to 4am on Monday 11 October we will be working around the clock on the platforms. Work includes:

installing services and drainage

- excavating and concreting footings and columns for new canopy
- installing scaffolding with a working platform
- removing materials from site.

In the event of bad weather or delays during this weekend, we will complete the work outlined above from 11.59pm on Friday 15 October to 4am on Monday 18 October. If we need to work this weekend we will notify the surrounding community in advance.

From 11.59pm on Friday 22 October to 4am on Monday 25 October we will be working around the clock on the platforms. Work includes:

- installing reinforced footbridge columns
- pouring concrete

removing materials from site.

Mid-week work

Work during the day includes:

- piling, concreting and excavating
- reinforcing the site entrance embankment
- tree removal adjacent to Platform 1 and 4
- replacing the perimeter fence adjacent to Platform 4
- installing services around the station.

*Change of standard construction hours: The NSW Government has introduced extended operating hours for construction sites to support the industry during the evolving COVID-19 situation, with sites now able to operate on weekends and public holidays. The standard construction hours at this station is 7am-6pm Monday to Sunday, including public holidays.

Bridge Street footpath and cyclepath

Throughout October there will be intermittent closures of the footpath on Bridge Street, adjacent to Platform 4. This is for the safe parking of a concrete truck and a pump and vacuum truck for work on Platform 4.

Please use the other footpath. Cyclists will also be asked to dismount or safely enter Bridge Street under traffic control measures. Please see map overleaf showing these changes.

What to expect

Throughout October, other Transport projects will also be working in and around the station. We'll be implementing noise reduction measures like using noise blankets, turning equipment off when not in use and placing equipment as far from properties as possible.

Construction lighting will be turned away from properties or turned off when not required to help reduce light spill.

Stockpiling of and removal of materials will be carried out adjacent to Bridge Street and Platform 1.

Equipment to be used throughout October includes: excavator, piling rig, road saw, tipper truck, concrete truck and pumps, vacuum truck, grinder, dump truck, handheld breaker, chainsaw, chipper, task lighting, lighting towers generators, and various hand and power tools.

There will also be deliveries and removal of plant and materials from site via the Swanson Street, Macdonaldtown and Eveleigh Yard rail access gates. Deliveries will be made under traffic and pedestrian control measures.

The Erskineville Station Upgrade team is committed to following the advice of the NSW Government, abiding to all COVID-19 safe practices.
