

Power Supply Upgrade

DC Feeder Upgrade Project - Lewisham

COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

November 2021

Transport for NSW is making improvements to electrical infrastructure to meet expected power requirements for Sydney's future rail network and new fleet of air-conditioned trains. As part of this, Transport for NSW is carrying out power supply upgrade work through our DC Feeder Upgrade Project.

Project overview

The DC Feeder Upgrade Project will improve power delivery to the railway and involves the replacement of electrical cables and overhead wiring infrastructure across a number of sites in the rail network, including at Lewisham.

Weekday work – Monday 22 November to Friday 17 December 2021

From Monday 22 November to Friday 17 December 2021 between the hours of 7am to 6pm, on weekdays, work will be carried out to prepare Lewisham Substation for upgraded electrical infrastructure.

Works will involve removal of vegetation from the embankment adjacent to the substation, stabilising the embankment and installing erosion controls. Other works will involve cable installation, borehole digging, geotechnical works and installation of scaffolding.

Weekend work – Saturday 11 December to Sunday 12 December 2021

Between 6am Saturday 11 December until 6pm Sunday 12 December 2021 we will be working at Lewisham Substation to upgrade power supply cables, including embankment clearing adjacent to the substation.

Workers will access the site from Alfred Street, Lewisham. To allow safe access of work vehicles and equipment, parking in Alfred Street will be temporarily unavailable from 5pm Thursday 9 December until 5.30pm Saturday 11 December 2021. Traffic management will be in place to ensure the safety of the community and workers.

These works are carried out while also complying with the current Public Health Orders and a COVID-19 Safe Plan is in place, including masks and QR codes.

Equipment used during the work activity will include excavators, concrete truck, borehole drill, vacuum truck, welding machines, a tipper and a crane, along with various handheld power tools including drills and grinders.
