The Normanhurst Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

Project update

The Normanhurst Station Upgrade team have successfully completed the piling work for the new lifts. You may have noticed the site team working in and around the station during November using a vacuum truck to identify services and cables, as well as working on the waiting room on platform 2, to make it compliant and accessible for the community.

We understand that this year has been challenging for all, so the Normanhurst Station Upgrade project team would like to thank the community for their understanding and support for the project.



Our work will conclude for this year on Tuesday 21 December and resume on Monday 10 January 2022.

December work

Work will continue up until Tuesday 21 December at Normanhurst Station and will include:

- work on the new lifts, with concrete and excavation work
- installation of cables within the rail corridor

- construction of the new and existing station entrance on Denman Parade and Platform 1 waiting room
- construction of a new electrical Pad-mount within the rail corridor.

Temporary removal of parking

During December, approximately five car parking spaces on Denman Parade between Normanhurst Road and Buckingham Avenue will be temporarily unavailable.

Plant and equipment

Equipment used throughout December includes excavators, vacuum trucks, road saws, tripper trucks, concrete trucks and pumps, dump trucks, with various hand and power tools.
