

Commuter Car Park Program Schofields

More commuter parking at Schofields is on the way

Planning approval has been granted for a new ground level commuter car park, providing approximately 700 additional parking spaces to the west of Schofields Station.

Thank you to everyone who provided feedback on the proposed concept design. Feedback received from the community was considered in the development of the Review of Environmental Factors, the formal planning document for the project. Key themes raised during consultation

Some of the key themes raised during consultation include:

Request for more than 700 spaces


The car park is designed to meet current and future demand in Schofields and surrounding suburbs.

Request for multi-storey car park

Multiple options were considered before the current proposal was progressed for community feedback.

A new ground level commuter car park is considered the best option in delivering much needed additional commuter parking to the community in the shortest timeframe. This option also provides the greatest flexibility should we need to modify or adapt the land around longer term, future transport developments in the precinct.

There are currently no plans to construct a multi-storey car park at Schofields Station however the current proposal does not preclude any future plans for a multi-storey car park.

Entry and exit to the car park

Traffic assessments have been undertaken to understand traffic flows in the area and how commuters will enter and exit the car park. Multiple entry and exit points to the car park will enable commuters travelling from surrounding suburbs to efficiently enter and exit.

Altrove Boulevard and Calder Street will be constructed as part of development in the area. We are liaising with Stockland for the timing of these works to align with the car park opening.

Landscaping in the new car park

We had some questions from the community regarding landscaping in the car park. Trees will be planted throughout the car park to provide shade and around the perimeter of the car park to help minimise visual impacts.

Next steps

We have engaged Stephen Edwards Constructions to design and construct the new commuter car park on behalf of Transport for NSW and detailed design is now underway. Site investigations including survey and geotechnical investigations will commence over the next few months.

Major construction of the new car park will begin in coming months with the new car park expected to be open to commuters by mid 2022.
