Towradgi Station upgrade

The NSW Government is improving accessibility at Towradgi Station. This upgrade will be delivered as part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a better experience for public transport customers by delivering modern, safe and accessible infrastructure.



Contract has been awarded

Since receiving planning approval in late 2020, contract for the design and construction of Towradgi Station upgrade has been awarded to Degnan Constructions.

Degnan Constructions is delivering the upgrade on behalf of Transport for NSW and will carry out investigations to inform the project design ahead of the start of construction mid this year.

Thank you to everyone who provided feedback on the proposed concept design. Your feedback has helped the project team to understand what is important to customers and the community.

Project overview

The Towradgi Station upgrade will provide a station that is accessible to those with a disability, limited mobility, carers/parents with prams and customers with luggage.

Key features of the station upgrade include:

- A new footbridge over the rail corridor connecting the platforms of Towradgi Station
- Two new lifts which will have three stops including platform level, road/pedestrian level and footbridge level. Lift landings will also have weather protection canopies at the waiting areas
- New footpaths to connect Towradgi Road and Weber Crescent to the station and the new footbridge, as well as footpaths to the new accessible car spaces and kiss and ride area
- Two accessible parking spaces and a kiss and ride zone on Weber Crescent
- New stairs on either side of the footbridge
- Replacing the existing station toilet with a new family accessible toilet
- Replacement of platform shelters
- Minor regrading and widening of the station platforms
- Ancillary upgrades such as upgrades to closed circuit television (CCTV), lighting, handrails, drainage works, landscaping, wayfinding and signage
- Construction of a new station services equipment room (SSER) next to Weber Crescent.

Project update - onsite investigation work

From Monday 15 March until Saturday 10 April, site investigation and minor work will be carried out between the hours of 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday, and 8am to 1pm Saturday. The results from the investigations will help us inform the final design of the project to the community.

Work will include:

- Geotechnical investigations
- Locating underground services
- Site surveying
- Investigations of electrical and signalling services
- Dilapidation and existing building reports.

These works are not expected to generate elevated levels of noise however where possible, measures will be implemented to reduce noise associated with this work, including turning off vehicles when not in use, noise monitoring, using non-tonal reversing beepers and stopping work for respite periods. The work is not expected to impact customer journeys.
