West Ryde Station

Project update

Transport for NSW is delivering additional commuter car parking at West Ryde Station to provide the community with more convenient access to public transport and reduce congestion on our roads.

The new car park will be located along Ryedale Road and will provide the community with approximately 100 additional commuter parking spaces. The car park is expected to be completed and open to the community by the end of 2021.

Progress update

In June, earthworks and removal of redundant material was completed. Detailed excavation to allow for inground services also began.

Detailed design

Detailed design for the new commuter car park is progressing. We will share the updated design with the community shortly.

Upcoming construction work

During July and August, the following works will occur on the new car park:

- Installation of new in ground services
- Removal of old rail corridor fence and installation of new rail corridor fence
- Installation of new car park surfaces, kerb and gutters
- Installation of above ground services
- Line marking for new car park surface
- Installation of new CCTV system

Work along Ryedale Road – temporary impacts to footpath and on street parking

In July stormwater installation work will take place along the pedestrian footpath on the station side of Ryedale Road and will occur in two stages. In order to complete this work safely, approximately 160m of pedestrian pathway will be temporarily unavailable.

Stage one will take place from Monday 5 July – Friday 9 July. A small site compound will be set up on the footpath opposite Herbert Street, on the station side of Ryedale Road, and approximately three on-street parking spaces will be unavailable.

Stage two is scheduled to commence in late July and will take approximately two days to complete. A small site compound will be set up on the footpath opposite Wattle Street, on the station side of Ryedale Road, and approximately one on-street parking space will be unavailable.

There will be no impact to the bus zone along Ryedale Road during this work.

For pedestrian access between the station and the northern commuter car park during this work, please use the pedestrian footpath on the shop side of Ryedale Road. Signage will be installed to assist customers with the temporary changes.

Construction hours

Work will take place during standard construction hours between **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays.** Deliveries will be scheduled outside of peak times wherever possible to minimise disruption to pedestrians and motorists.

Council Works along Ryedale Road

City of Ryde Council is undertaking work along Ryedale Road as part of the Ryedale Road Town Centre Upgrade project, and have engaged Ferrycarrig to deliver the project on their behalf. Upcoming work will include demolition and construction of new kerb and gutters, new light poles and installation of new underground electrical and stormwater service lines. This work is scheduled to take place at night starting at 4:30pm for the next few weeks.
