Wollstonecraft Station Upgrade

Project update

February 2021

Transport for NSW is upgrading Wollstonecraft Station to make it easier for everyone to access, including people with a disability or limited mobility, parents/carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

Upcoming work

Work will continue in February and includes:

- construction of the lift walls on Platform 1 and 2
- electrical upgrades on Platform 1
- toilet refurbishment (one unisex toilet will remain open)
- delivering and removing materials
- renovation of the station waiting room on Platform 2 to provide new wheelchair accessible spaces and new benches

- piling work on the eastern entry to Platform 1 off Shirley Road
- bridge and lift landing work on the western entry to Platform 2 off Shirley Road
- excavation of trenches for electrical services throughout the station precinct
- drainage installation on both platforms.

Equipment to be used includes excavators, trucks, grinders, saws, cranes, rattle guns, piling rigs, plumbing tools, scaffolding, demolition tools, pallet jacks, trucks and hand tools.

Traffic control will be in place intermittently to ensure safe pedestrian and vehicle movements around the work site. Some on-street parking may be used intermittently where required to carry out the work.

Night work in February 2021

We will be carrying out investigations of services and platform wall conditions over 2 nights on **Tuesday 2 and Wednesday 3 February 2021**. This work will be completed between **1am** and **4am**. For the safety of our staff and to minimise impacts to train services, this work is scheduled during a Sydney Trains trackwork period, when trains aren't running.

Equipment will include handheld survey equipment and is not expected to be noisy. Thank you for your patience during this important work.

Temporary changes to the station toilets

Work is in progress to refurbish the existing toilets at Wollstonecraft Station which will provide one family accessible toilet and two ambulant toilets.

To enable this upgrade, one toilet will be closed at a time while work is carried out. During this time one toilet will be converted to a unisex toilet for all customers to use. Signage is in place to direct customers to the unisex toilet.

Temporary pedestrian access, parking and road changes

From **7am Monday 4 January** to **5pm Friday 12 February 2021**, the entrance to **Platform 1** from Shirley Road is temporarily closed to enable construction work to be completed safely. This is to allow piling work to be carried out and an electrical transformer to be installed. Customers will detour via the Platform 2 entry through the underpass or via Shirley Lane to access Platform 1.

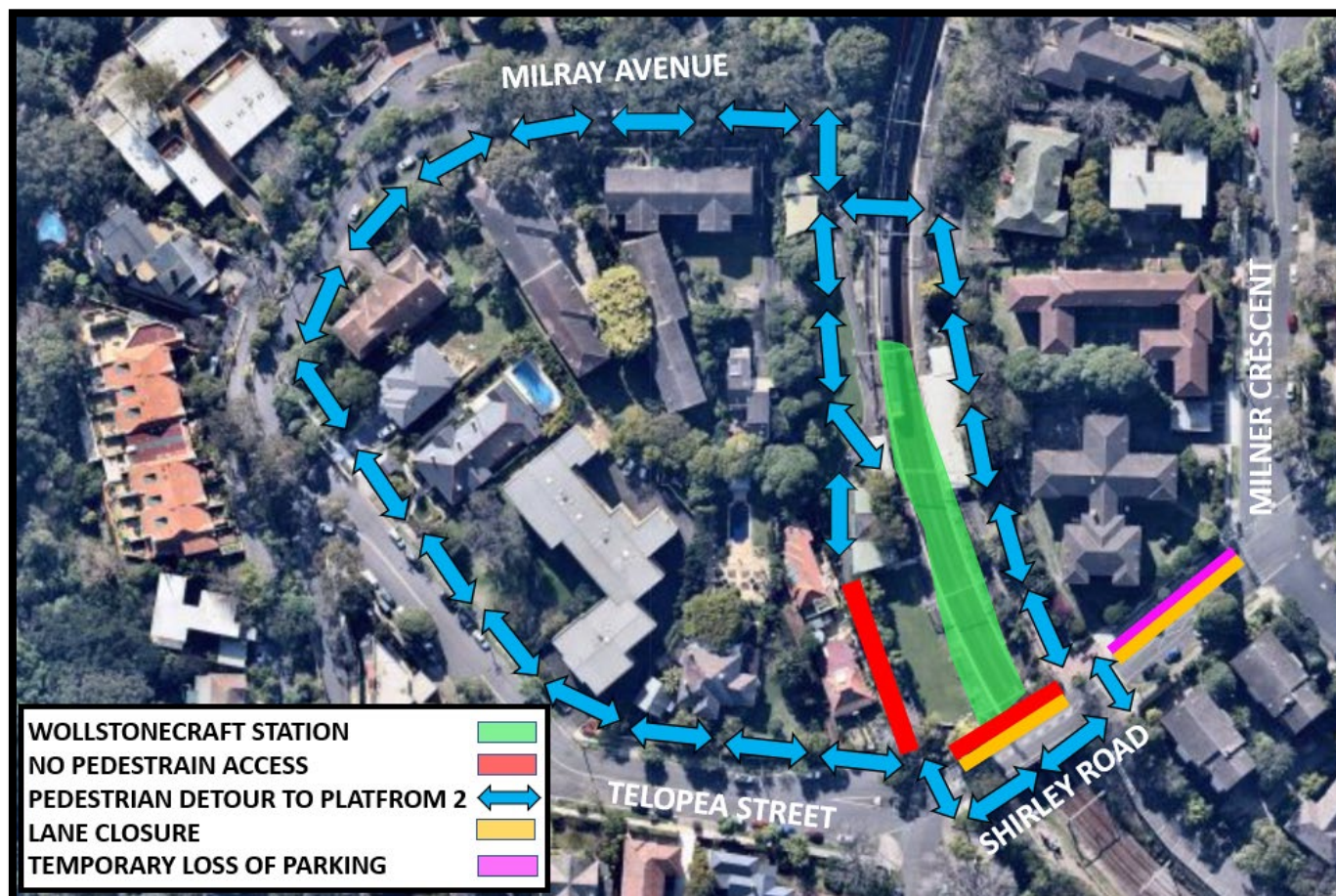
From **7am Monday 15 February** to **5pm Friday 26 February 2021**, the entrance to **Platform 2** from Shirley Road will be temporarily closed to enable construction work to be completed safely. This is to allow bridge and lift landing work to be carried out. Customers will detour via the Platform 1 entry through the underpass or via Millay Avenue to access Platform 2.

During these closures, the northern footpath on Shirley Road Bridge and the eastbound lane on Shirley Road bridge between Telopea Street and Milner Crescent will be closed intermittently. Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist pedestrians and motorists while the changes are in place.

Up to five parking spaces will be temporarily closed on Shirley Road between Wollstonecraft Station and Milner Crescent during this time. Vehicle and pedestrian access to 50 Shirley Road will be maintained at all times.
