Wollstonecraft Station Upgrade

Project update

November 2021

Transport for NSW is upgrading Wollstonecraft Station as part of the Transport Access Program (TAP) to make it easier for everyone to access, including people with a disability or limited mobility, parents/carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

Upcoming work

Work at Wollstonecraft Station will continue in November and will include:

- installing new handrails
- excavation and concreting
- lift louvre installation on both platforms
- power supply changeover for the station buildings
- asphalting of the eastern and western walkways and footpaths.

In order to complete this work, workers will require the use of equipment including trucks, excavators, jackhammers, grinders, cranes, rattle guns, plumbing tools, scaffolding, concrete trucks, pump trucks, dump trucks and hand tools.

Weekend work in November

From **6pm on Friday 5 November** to **10pm Sunday 7 November 2021**, work will take place continuously during a Sydney Trains trackwork weekend, when trains are not running.

Work will include:

- line marking and painting on both platforms
- work on lift shafts on both platforms
- power supply changeover for the station buildings.

Equipment to be used includes: elevated work platform, cranes, lighting towers, air compressors, hand tools.

This work will be noisy at times. Wherever possible, measures to reduce noise will be implemented including scheduling noisy work during daytime hours, turning off vehicles and equipment when not in use, monitoring noise, using non-tonal reversing beepers and acoustic barriers.

Access changes and road closures during weekend work

There will be temporary changes to traffic, parking and pedestrian movements around the station while weekend work is carried out.

The traffic changes will include:

One lane on Shirley Road will be intermittently closed for deliveries.

Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists, as stop/slow traffic arrangements will be present.

The **pedestrian changes** will include:

- Pedestrian access to and through the station will be closed from Shirley Road, Shirley Lane and from Milray Avenue. Pedestrian access for residents will be maintained from Shirley Lane.
- The pedestrian underpass will be closed during the work.

The parking changes will include:

• Two parking spaces on Shirley Road will be temporarily closed to allow for the delivery of materials.

Please allow extra travel time and follow the instructions of traffic control staff and signage while this work is carried out. Please see the map below outlining these impacts and detours.

Temporary pedestrian access changes during November and December

A number of pedestrian detours impacting the Shirley Road Bridge and access to platforms 1 and 2 from Shirley Road are planned for November. Signage will be in place to direct customers to pedestrian detours.

From **5am Monday 8 November to 6pm Friday 12 November**, the entrance to Platform 2 from Shirley Road will be temporarily closed. Access to businesses on Platform 2 will be maintained. Access to Platform 2 and Platform 2 businesses will be available via Milray Avenue and the pedestrian underpass.

From **5am Monday 15 November to 6pm Sunday 21 November**, the entrance to Platform 1 from Shirley Road will be temporarily closed. Access to Platform 1 and Platform 1 businesses will be available via Shirley Lane and the pedestrian underpass.

From **5am Monday 22 November to 6pm Friday 26 November**, the entrance to Platform 1 from Shirley Lane will be temporarily closed. Access to Platform 1 and Platform 1 businesses will be available via Shirley Road.

Customers will be required to follow pedestrian detour routes. Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist pedestrians while these changes are in place.



Refurbished station toilets

We will continue to refurbish the existing toilets at Wollstonecraft Station to provide one family accessible toilet and two ambulant toilets. While work is carried out to enable the refurbishments, one toilet will be closed and one toilet will be converted to a unisex toilet for all customers to use. Signage is in place to direct customers to the unisex toilet.

Construction hours

Standard construction hours are 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm on Saturdays.

For the safety of staff, rail customers and the community, some work will be completed outside standard construction hours. Nearby residents and businesses will be notified before any work outside these hours takes place.
