Temporary closure of Redleaf Avenue bridge

What is happening at the Redleaf Avenue bridge?

Redleaf Avenue bridge is undergoing major maintenance work. The first stage of this work involves the diversion of utilities and services, piling work and the removal and replacement of the road pavement for one lane of the bridge and reconstruction of the footbridge.

When will Redleaf Avenue bridge be open to traffic?

From Saturday 29 May to Friday 4 June, the Redleaf Avenue bridge will be open to traffic traveling in both directions with a stop/slow arrangement in place, meaning traffic can enter and leave the village via the Redleaf Avenue bridge.


The traffic arrangement is being trialled in response to customer and stakeholder feedback which we heard regarding traffic flow through the Wahroonga village. We will be seeking feedback on how the trial works to help reduce the impact of future traffic changes on the community

When will Redleaf Avenue bridge be closed?

The Redleaf Avenue bridge will be temporarily closed to from **9pm Friday 4 June to 5am Monday 7 June** and **9pm Friday 11 June to 5am Tuesday 15 June** with northbound and southbound detours in place.

Why does a lane of the Redleaf Avenue bridge need to be closed?

This stage of the work involves the complete removal and replacement of the existing footbridge and station access, installation of the new lift shaft and concrete placement. During this work both lanes will be unsuitable for traffic and must be closed for work to be carried out safely.

How to access Wahroonga village if I can't use the Heritage Bridge?

Free accessibility shuttle buses will be operating while Redleaf Avenue bridge is closed. The shuttle buses will be stationed at Railway Avenue bus stop and Millewa Avenue bus stop.

The shuttle bus will be operating day and night for the duration of the Bridge closure. Buses will detour southbound via Ingram road or Rohini street and northbound via Rohini street.

How has the community been informed about these changes?

The community will be informed about the changes through a range of measures, including:

- Details about the closure will be included in the monthly notifications for June and distributed to all properties within 1000m of the station, as well as digitally to the project distribution list.
- Signage in Wahroonga Village including large detour and changed traffic signage and a roadside variable messaging board.
- Businesses and directly affected residential properties will be doorknocked to raise awareness
 of the closure and detour routes.
- Geo-targeted social media posts
- Dedicated project webpage with project information
- Newspaper advertisement in the North Shore Times
- Traffic control and signage will be on site at the Redleaf Avenue Bridge to assist pedestrians and motorists during construction.
