| Is water at the school contaminated? | Dept Education | Complete |
| The testing of the school's water supply in 2020 and 2022 does not indicate that the rainwater tanks have been contaminated with lead from the site in the rail corridor. The reduction in lead concentration after flushing indicates that the lead detected in the first flush samples in 2020 came from lead solder in joints in the copper pipe, or brass parts of the bubblers. | | |
| These are common sources of lead in plumbing, and NSW Health have confirmed this can be effectively managed with flushing measures. NSW Health's guidance is based on nationally agreed guidance from en-Health . For further information please refer to the NSW Health webpage Drinking water flushing and management for schools . | | |
| Dept Education to provide reports from 12 March 2020 to the community. | Dept Education | Complete |

| Can the bubblers be capped, and school kids supplied with bottled water until the community is satisfied about the health of the water? | NSW Health | Complete |

| The responsibility to provide safe drinking water rests with each water supplier. The Department of Education is the drinking water supplier for Tarago School and has agreed to provide a more detailed response to this question. | | |
| NSW Health can confirm that the Department of Education is addressing potential risks to human health by implementing its Quality Assurance Program, which is required under the NSW Public Health Act. The Department of Education has provided two consecutive sets of sampling results in which lead concentrations are below the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines value. The Department has also implemented appropriate management actions to address the risk of lead from plumbing fittings. | | |

| There is not an ongoing health risk for which NSW Health would need to direct the Department of Education to cap the bubblers as requested, or make them replace their plumbing. NSW Health will continue to liaise with the Department of Education to ensure risks continue to be mitigated. | | |

| When will Transport start enforcing the 20-minute wait on the rail line? This was sold as the benefit of the loop extension project. We don't want trains waiting behind the school for hours. | Transport | Complete |
| The standard operating approach is: the loaded train service leaving Sydney waits at Goulburn until confirmation that the empty train service leaving Crisp Creek will depart on or close to time. | | |

 upon arrival at Tarago, the loaded train service waits for the departure of the empty train service, and only at this point will the loaded train service enter the loop. The intent is that the trains cross neatly at Tarago.

There are processes in place and a requirement that the Network Controller on duty escalate to the Train Control Manager if the loop needs to be used for an extended time.

The stabling of trains behind the school for hours should only happen on an ad hoc basis. This may happen where there is an incident or unplanned event such as delays with the passenger service from Canberra.

Additionally, UGLRL have committed to changing work instructions and the timetable to better articulate where this train should be pulled up under differing circumstances.
