
Erskineville Station Upgrade

The Erskineville Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a Station that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

Footbridge installation from Saturday 21 May to Sunday 22 May

The project will be taking advantage of this weekend when no trains will be running. We will install both sides of the new footbridge, canopies and canopy columns. We will also be installing new services and drainage into the platforms.

Work will start at **7am on Saturday 21 May** and will continue around the clock through to **midnight on Sunday 22 May 2022**.



How will this impact you?

A crane will be set up on Bridge Street to support the work. The crane is oversized and needs to be delivered overnight on Thursday 19 May when there is less traffic on the road.

From 4pm on Thursday 19 May, Bridge Street will be gradually closed, from the north end moving south, while we set up our equipment.

The full closure will begin at 7am Friday 20 May and will fully reopen Monday 23 May at 6am.

Resident and pedestrian access will be maintained. Bridge Street resident parking will be temporarily relocated to the south end of Bridge Street and managed by traffic control.

We will need to temporarily remove approximately 4 parking spaces on Swanson Street to support this work. The parking spaces will be reinstated when the work has been completed.

Saturday 21 May is polling day for the federal election, you can access Erskineville Public School via Bridge Street and Malcolm Street, Bridge Street is pedestrian access only.

Considering neighbours

Our staff will be on hand to help people and motorists move safely around the area.

Our work will be noisy at times. We will use mitigation measures such as noise blankets, turning equipment off when not in use and placing equipment as far from properties as possible. We will turn lighting away from properties and turn them off when not in use.

Bridge Street Rest Area

The crane and large construction vehicles will access Bridge Street via the Bridge Street rest area between Erskineville Station and Erskineville Public School on Swanson Street. The turfed area will be replaced with stone and metal plates for heavy vehicles to drive over.

The rest area will be upgraded after this weekend including new seating and paved path, landscaping and planting. Details of this work can be found on the City of Sydney website.
