



Commuter Car Park Program Emu Plains

Community Notification | April 2022

Project overview

Transport for NSW is constructing a new commuter car park at Emu Plains Station to provide the community with more convenient access to public transport and reduce congestion on our roads. The project is jointly funded by the Australian and NSW Governments. The car park, which will be accessed via a new roundabout at the intersection of Old Bathurst Road and Smith Street, will provide approximately 750 additional commuter parking spaces.


Progress update

In March, earthworks and construction of new roundabout continued within the car park site. Utilities upgrade work took place along the eastern side of Old Bathurst Road. Work also progressed on the construction of ramps leading to the new footbridge.

Night work from 11 April

From Monday 11 April 2022, up to six nights of work between 6pm and 6am are planned to occur over five weeks, subject to weather and approvals. This is to continue utilities upgrade work, including gas and high voltage electrical services, along Old Bathurst Road.

Traffic changes will be in place during this work with a temporary full road closure of Old Bathurst Road, between Great Western Hwy and Smith Street, planned for up to three weeknights in the week of 11 April between 8pm and 5am (subject to weather and approvals). Workers will be on site from 6pm. A detour will be in place via Russell Street, and access to properties and businesses north of the railway line will be maintained via Smith Street. Traffic control and signs will be in place.




Detour during closure of Old Bathurst Road, 8pm to 5am during the week of 11 April 2022 (subject to approval).

Traffic changes on Smith Street from 28 March

As previously notified, temporary traffic changes limiting left-hand turns out of Smith Street are planned from Monday 28 March. All vehicles over six metres (6m) long must turn right onto Old Bathurst Road from Smith Street. These vehicles can proceed to Russell Street for access to the Great Western Highway or use David Road and Sommerville Circuit to turn right onto Old Bathurst Road (please refer to map over the page). This traffic arrangement will be necessary for the safe construction of the new roundabout and is expected to be in place for approximately ten weeks, weather permitting.

What else is planned

The following work is planned to occur in April:

- Lighting, landscaping and footpath improvements on Old Bathurst Road near footbridge
- Earthworks, civil and drainage work, and removing excavated materials
- Work on the new roundabout on Old Bathurst Road including stormwater drainage work, lighting and the start of roadwork.

Equipment to be used will include excavators, road saw, grader, bulldozers, tipping trucks, jack hammers, concrete mixers, service vehicles, various delivery vehicles, mobile crane, and hand tools.

All work is subject to weather, site conditions and COVID restrictions, and may change without notice.
